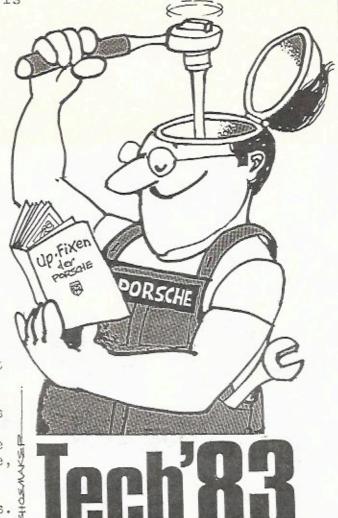


Technical Information And Fun Too

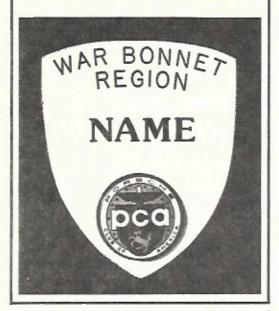

Attention War Bonnet Members

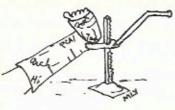

P6 vs. 3011

Tires: There are 14,261 different opinions on what tires are best for a Porsche, most of which are based on someone else's opinion rather than your own. Having said that, I'd like to offer my opinion (number 14,262) of the Pirelli P6 and the Phoenix 3011 based on a year's worth of driving on both types of tires (not at the same time...). What I found was not what I expected



Pirelli P6: I've got a set of 205/60 x 15s on my 912E. The car is lowered, decambered, contains the strangest combination of front rear sway bars in history and has neutral handling under most conditions. Here's how the P6s work:

- Straight line tracking is excellent, even with all four wheels decambered.

- Lateral adhesion exceeds the physical capability of most of the Region members I know... They are unreal in turns on dry pavement (the tires).

- They are not oversensitive to variations in <u>air</u> pressure.

- Wear is excellent.

- Braking in the dry is excellent.

- Braking in the wet is good as long as there isn't a lot of standing water on

the pavement.

- These tires will hydroplane at highway speeds without letting you know. Your first hint will be when the grass starts coming closer through no effort on your part...

- At same speeds they are OK on ice... Not great,

but OK.



Phoenix 3011: I've got 185/70 x 14s on my 924. The 924 is set up identical to the 912E and has almost neutral handling (almost because I haven't replaced the weak right side torsion bar yet). Here's how the 3011s work:

- Straight line tracking is outstanding. The car feels like it is on rails.

- Lateral adhesion almost reaches the Pos... ("almost" ecuals a tour in the grass)

- They aren't sensitive to air pressure variations

unless driven hard. Then, higher pressures are recuired to prevent rolling on the sidewalls.

- Wear is good, but not ouite as good as the P6s due to the aggressive tread and soft rubber.

Over a 40,000 mile period, I'd guess the 3011s would go 6,000 miles less than the P6s.

- Breaking in dry and wet is excellent.

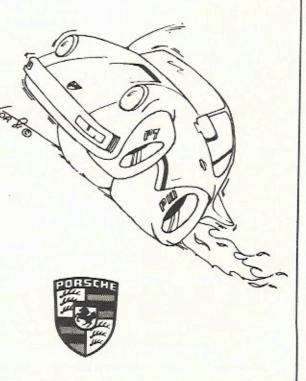
- Hydroplaning can be induced at extremely high speeds (70 plus) on standing water, but overall they are the best wet weather tire I've ever been on.

- They are excellent on snow and good on ice. The only drawback is the extremely light steering caused by the built-in lack of rolling resistance of the tires. This causes oversteering and overcorrection until you get used to it. By the time you get used to it, the snow and ice are gone!

Conclusion: Both tires are super, but for different uses. For the Porsche that doesn't get used daily but is saved for summer tours, autocrosses, rallies and general recreational purposes, I'd recommend the P6. For the

"other" Porsche or the "flog-on-a-daily-basisyear-round" car, the Phoenix is hard to beat. Good traction, light steering, super handling and acceptable wear make it a logical (and less expensive) choice. Either tire will improve your car's handling, but don't call me and complain when you can't exit 144 at 80 MPH in the middle of an ice storm... Just send our editor your opinion number 14,263!

From The War Bonnet Gourmet

When I was a kid I used to go in to NYC to see my Dad at work as an NBC studio musician. We'd always go to an Automat for lunch where my favorite was a crock of baked beans and a ham on rye. After many years I longed for those beans I remembered. It took me almost 20-years to come up with the recipe, but I'll share it with you in the next few minutes.

MOTHER GEORGE'S BOSTON SYMPHONY

Add two pounds of small white (Navy or pea) beans to a pot with at least 1" of water to cover them. Bring to a boil and reduce heat to simmer for an hour (or until al dente). While simmering, pan fry one pound of bacon cut into 2" bits until almost crisp. Remove bacon from pan and add a diced medium onion and saute. Drain beans in a collendar and place in a crock-pot, adding the bacon, onion and all grease. In a separate bowl, mix the

following: 14 cup catsup, 3 tsp dry mustard, 1-3/4 cup brown sugar, 2/3 cup molasses, 12 Tsp salt, and 2 cup water. After mixed, carefully add to the ingredients already in the crock-pot. With a long-handled wooden spoon, mix everything in the crock-pot thoroughly. Set the temperature control on the lowest heat setting (medium or low) and let the mixture cook for 21 hours. Stir everything once about every six hours to allow the bacon grease to add its flavor throughout. Enjoy. GEORGE W. STARCH III

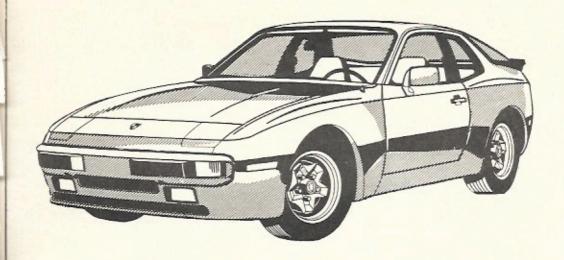
