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# Treasurer's Tid-Bits

he treasury continues in sound shape. My standard opening line is still very accurate.

By the time you read this, the club Christmas party will likely be history. The new venue at the Devon Tower 50th floor restaurant brought out the biggest turnout of club members in many years. The room will only accommodate 60 people. We have not had 60 people for the Christmas party in recent memory. I don't think we have had a turnout this large since the Tulsa area split away and formed a separate region back in the 1980s.

Many of you know of my annual trips to Porsche Parade in my 1985 911 Carrera. I bought my 911 back in 1995 with just 80,000 miles on it. Since then I have added 70,000 miles and I turned 150,000 miles this summer. During the inspection after the trip to Michigan, I noticed one cylinder head was a little wet with oil. That is never a good thing.

After the engine was back out for further inspection, I decided the only logical next step was to remove the head and see what was really going on. The diagnosis was not great. That head needed to be fly cut to get back to good smooth aluminum. If you cut one head,

you have to cut all six heads to make them match. While you are in there, you might as well do a valve job since the head is off. While you are in there, you might as well slide the pistons and cylinders off to inspect them. The rings were worn, so those needed to be replaced as well. The great news is the pistons & cylinders were in perfect shape.

The reason the head leaked is two of the Dilivar head studs were loose. While you are in there, it is crazy not to replace all the head studs. That leaves just a bare case and a few more bolts will open the case, so while you are in there it would be crazy not to open the bottom end and just do a full rebuild.

I am real happy I decided to go into the bottom end. One rod had some hot spots and the intermediate shaft bearings had a lot of wear. While you are in there, you might as well do some machine work on the case and clean up some things.

In the end I will have a complete rebuild and comfort in knowing that the engine will easily go another 200,000 miles. I did learn the phrase "while you are in there" can be expensive, but it really is useful.

The next time you see my car, it will have a rebuilt engine. I rebuilt the transmission last year. I have completely rebuilt the suspension and replaced all the rubber bushings with new rubber bushings. The shocks are new, the brakes are fresh. The suspension rebuild included the steering so that is new. The air conditioning works better than the

factory system. About all that is left is a pedal bushing rebuild, and I have those bushings already. I bought the pedal bushings several years ago and I just need to put them in. My 28 year old car will be in better shape than new. The trip to Monterrey, California next June will be fun and relaxing.

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




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
