
I am eager to find out who the new board members will be and I am sure they will have input about events and activities and maybe we will see some new events in our calendar.

he club checking account is at \$7,227.20 as of the end of 2017. We have not had many expenses in recent months with the autocross season on hiatus. The club Christmas Party was not subsidized by the club this year. Every person was responsible for their own tab, and we had a good showing of members.

I just filled out some of the silly paperwork that PCA national requires every year. The biggest part of the operating budget for the club was our autocross for many years. Now we are happy to break even on an autocross, so the PCA national rebate each quarter is a big part of the income for the region. If you want to really bore your family and friends with trivia, you can that the them club incorporated on July 10th, 1967. We did not apply for and receive a tax exempt status until April of 1976. That was before I was part of WBR so it was not my fault!

The Out and Back trip to Arkansas was canceled per Steve Hintze.


