
along with a viewing of some special planes. Dinner will be served as well so it looks like it will be a really nice event.



# Treasurer's Tid-Bits

he checking account is at \$7,589.99 as of the middle of June. We had a few expenses, mostly the club autocross. The good old days of the autocross as a cash cow are over. Now we have the new reality of losing money for the autocross. The last two autocrosses have lost money. We pay \$200 to rent the facility, and an additional \$150 for security from an Edmond police officer.

The autocross in May was on Mother's day, and had a poor turnout. The June autocross had a poor turnout of just eight cars and we lost \$150 on the event, even though the weather was great. We need to promote the autocross more to other clubs, and encourage more War Bonnet members to participate. It is a mostly first and second gear track and still a lot of fun. Matt Herndon does a great job of building the track layout and working hard to run a good event.

We had a recent new member party, and we only one new couple attended. In the past the club paid for the pizza for everyone, but with the loss of the autocross income we changed it to current members pay for their own food, and only the new members received a free meal. Several years ago at a new member event we let the pizza ordering get totally out of hand, and I

ended up paying just over \$800 for pizza. We sure can't afford that now.

We do need to order some new radios for the autocross. The board has approved the purchase; we just need to get them ordered. They will cost a few hundred dollars, but will be necessary to successfully have a larger autocross turnout. Only a few of the radios we have now are still working.

Porsche Parade is coming up in a few weeks. It is an easy one-day trip to central Missouri. We have a great turnout this year for the region, likely the largest turnout since the Colorado parade back in 2009. The Fort Worth parade in 2004 also had a good turnout of War Bonnet members. That one was special because Bob Miller was a regional member and the national president at the time.


Once underway again, we made our way to Siloam Springs for lunch. We had a great lunch and had a good time. From there we made our way back home through Tulsa and down the Turnpike.
