





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

Selling My First Porsche

ome say life begins when you're 16. For me, that would be 1988 when I got my first set of car keys to my 1978 Porsche 911 SC Targa. Yes, my first car was a Porsche 911. My parents agreed a paid for car that was 10 years old was the best choice for me to drive full time. There is not enough room in this War Hoop to say how cool it was in high school to drive a Porsche 911. Back then, the 964 body had not come out yet and my '78 looked current day when kids including me had posters of 930 Turbo's on their wall.

In the spring of 1989, I found a PCA flyer in my front seat someone had slipped through my window. "No way! There is a club for Porsche nuts like me?" I went to my first PCA meeting at 16yrs old and joined the club. Thirtyfour years later, my best friends can mostly be traced back to PCA roots along with my love of cars and experience in racing. Through most of the 90's, I was a frequent PCA member on Spring & Fall Tours. This led to auto-x and eventually HPDE events at Hallett. My longest drive took me to Brainerd Minnesota where I raced the car all weekend at the World of RuF event then drove it home. How lucky and young I was then. Never prepped the car....just packed up and took off for

Brainerd never looking back. It was a great trip and a complete success except for my 91mph speeding ticket in Kansas. At a New Mexico PCA event, I auto crossed the car and won the grand door prize which was a \$2000 B&B 4" duel exhaust!!!!! It was installed the minute I got home and it was the best upgrade I ever did. My mother & father had the car repainted charcoal black and redid the interior for me. They also put in an amazing stereo for one of my birthdays and I was pretty impressed. Two 12" subs took up the back seats in a custom box with 1000watts. Knowing what 16yr old boys do in their cars with their first girlfriend, I think the stereo filling up the back seat was dads form of birth control. Numerous drives to Oklahoma landmarks, festivals, and several NW Arkansas trips over the years have filled me with memories.

In the late '90's, my job took me away from Oklahoma and out of "active PCA" status. I am embarrassed to say, my beloved 911 SC started to sit more and more and became my 3rd car and once again took up it's position as a garage queen. Several years passed with my car never getting started. Like a time machine, the dust collected and the car deteriorated. However, recently,

I got reacquainted with an old PCA buddy Brian Swope. I was getting back into cars and Brian agreed to bring my 911 out of moth balls. Dust, mildew, and years of neglect took its toll. After a few weeks, many pics, and \$4500 later, my 911 SC Targa now jumps to life! I drove it home just after Christmas and the memories were flowing. I was 16 all over again. Except, now I wanted to put it up for sale with big ideas on a newer race car project. Brian ran a craigslist ad that caught a buyers interest in less than 48hrs from the Netherlands. At the time of writing this, it's supposedly sold.

Coming full circle, I took my 6yr old twin boys for their first ride in Daddy's Porsche New Years Day. What a treat. I want to thank Brian Swope for bringing my 911 back to life. The immaculate details, paint work, painted fuchs, polished 3pc twists rims, and numerous interior treatments really caught me by surprise. DuMont Porsche completed the mechanical touches. If the sell falls through, I won't be too disappointed. Stay tuned as Brian and I turn our attention towards a '89 928S4 that is for sale.



Between the Cones

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t's that time of the year again. It's time to pull the car cover off your Porsche, check all of the fluids, and get it ready for a wonderful and beautiful spring. I hope everyone survived the winter and they are ready to get their cars out and start to enjoy them.

I have come to the conclusion that in the winter months it is hard to get both you and the car out to the autocrosses. I don't blame you. When the temperatures are down and it is cold outside, not too many want to get out there. But I would like to invite any and all to come out to at least one event. With the winter schedule, I tried to make it a short track so runs would go quicker. That way I can accomplish a few things. One is that your car stays warm; when I mean warm I'm talking about both inside and outside. On the inside, your heater keeps the car warm for you, you're not freezing every time you get back in your car. On the outside would include your tires and all of the fluids in your car especially the oil.

Second, in doing a small track when it's cold you are less likely to slide off the track and break something on your cold tires. I know that some of the regular non-Porsche members have come out to the autocross and enjoy all of the perks

like having a tight course. They also like not opening the throttle up on their cars but being able to see how their cars can handle. With a tight course and slower speeds you warm up everything which makes it less likely that you don't lose control and spin out. I'm hoping to see some new and old faces at the autocross and other events that we have planned.

In the winter months registration for the autocross starts at 10:00AM to 10:45AM and the drivers meeting is at 11:00AM. When the weather starts warming up the start times will change. In April we will start registration at 8:00AM to 8:45AM, with the driver's meeting starting at 9:00AM.

In setting up the schedule this year, I tried to have a couple of autocrosses on Saturdays in the warmer months every four months but was unable to secure a schedule that the board and I had agreed upon. Due to circumstances beyond our control, the schedule has a couple of Saturdays that are back to back (month after month). I know that some people are unable to make the Sunday autocross due to other arrangements; that is why we have done the Saturday ones.

We will have a Driver Tech's coming up in March and June. You ask 'what is Driver's Tech'? It is a free event for Porsche driver's to attend and drive your car on the track, but in a different way. We let one car at a time onto the course in order to see how your car will react. One of the events is using the braking system. Another one is G-Force. This is where we set up a fifty foot circle in the middle of the flat area on the track to see what you and your car can do with using the throttle to go around the cones. Last but not least, we do a maneuver to make you lose control of your car to see how you react to it and to see what over steering feels like.

I hoping with warmer weather, Saturday Autocrosses and the Driver's Tech we will see more people come out to enjoy their Porsches the way that Ferdinand Porsche envisioned them. And, of course, wanted people to enjoy them.





Meeting adjourned at 9:30 PM with the usual after-meeting camaraderie. Cheers to all and lets have a great 2013!




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
