War Bonnet Region includes everything, except the panhandle, west of Interstate 35 and some of the area east of Interstate 35 towards Muskogee. The area not in War Bonnet is part of the Cimarron Region, of which Tulsa is the major city much like Oklahoma City is the major city for War Bonnet. I would everyone recommend go www.zone5.pca.org which is our Zone 5 website. On this page you will find a great map that shows each individual region within Zone 5 and a calendar of events for the regions in Zone 5. On the Regions tab you will find every Region listed with the number of members in that Region and direct links to their FaceBook pages and their websites. This is a great way to find out what other Regions are doing and what events they are having where you could participate. Each region has contact information on their website and FaceBook pages where you can reach out to their members if you would like to participate in one of their activities. We are currently planning to have a morning drive to meet the Cimarron Region for breakfast one Saturday. 



Also at the end of the meeting Grady Buckhalter and Matt Herndon talked about the Zone 5 Presidents meeting in


