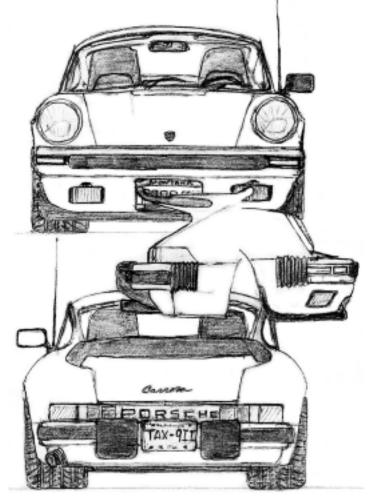

Chad Goodman and I had the opportunity to attend the Zone 5 President's meeting in Grapevine, TX on the 18th of February. There is always a tremendous amount of information given at these meetings. We had the opportunity to listen to talks by Steve Krysil, PCNA Regional Manager, Caren Cooper, PCA National President, and Ken Laborde, PCA Risk Management Chair.

Steve Krysil gave out two interesting facts. First, 72% of all Porsches sold in the US last year had four doors, and second, 64% were SUVs. Sales of these vehicles allow Porsche to continue to develop the sports cars that the other 28% of us enjoy.

Caren Cooper outlined the future vision of PCA, the Vision 2020 program. The Vision 2020 program's goal is to have 100,000 primary PCA members by the year 2020. The current membership is around 77,000. FYI, there are 678 Porsche clubs worldwide and all are owned by Porsche Auto Group except one, PCA.

Ken Laborde is the Insurance Chair and a defense lawyer. Liability insurance is PCA's second largest expense. The PCA policy covers event participants, officials, and instructors. There was much more discussion about moving events, non moving events, and waivers. It was actually a very interesting talk.

Exhausted and PCA brainwashed we travelled home. In the next issue, I will have some information about our renamed dealer, Porsche Oklahoma City.

Treasurer's Tid-Bits

B ack to my standard opening, the club finances are doing fine. We have not had an autocross so there is no other source of income except PCA national. I had to do a bit of research and I did learn that PCA pays us \$15.50 per year per membership as the standard rebate. Just recently I received this email from PCA

"The Executive Council is once again pleased to announce, for the fourth consecutive year, a member income surplus payment to the Regions. After reviewing our 2016 financials, it was agreed upon by your Executive Council at the PCA Winter Board meeting in February. This special surplus distribution is a direct result of the continued efficient operations of the entire PCA organization, continued membership growth and retention, strong value-based sponsorship programs and repeated success of our members-only raffle. Approximately \$454,000 of surplus funds from the 2016 fiscal year will be distributed to the Regions at a rate of \$6.00 per primary member as of December 31, 2016. The region rebate will post to your region account of record on March 27 in the amount of \$1,146."

That will just about cover the cost of our upcoming 50th anniversary party. I had to dig around in my attic to find

II. Zone 5 President's meeting was attended by Eric Costello and Chad Goodman. Several of the topics discussed at the meeting included gathering a list of passwords for the various web site and social media sites the club controls, better relations with the Porsche dealer and social media etiquette.

III. Email blasts coming from our local club will now have the War Bonnet logo at the top of the email to help identify them, while the National emails will only include the PCA logo.
