
area of Fenway and although I know someone will eventually find it and remove it, I will always believe my shirt is there forever watching over my Red Sox.

Treasurer's Tid-Bits

he club treasury has changed little, is still in balance, and it's a good balance. As of the last bank statement we had \$7,681.17 in the checking account. The last two autocrosses did make money, but not much. The charity car show had zero expenses, and 100% profit. We made \$320 which is the most ever made at one of the charity car shows. At some future board meeting we will discuss how much the club can add to that and send Sunbeam Family services another check.

Many of the regulars of the club noticed I was not driving my 911 to club functions. I missed driving my 911 to Parade and some autocrosses because my 911 was having issues with the transmission. Repairing transmission requires the engine and transmission to be dropped out of the car, and then separated to get to the transmission. In the end, my issue was actually a bad bearing on the pinion gear which allowed for movement that was in directions it is not supposed to move. That required a few expensive parts to be replaced, mainly the differential housing, and a couple of the bearings and some shims. None of the gears were hurt, and all the synchronizers were undamaged.

I finally got that done and up popped a

large fuel leak. It was the pressure line that goes from the fuel pump, up over the steering rack, through the firewall in the front of the tunnel, all the way to the engine compartment near the nose of the transmission. Of course the leak showed up AFTER the engine and transmission were back in place. If you look at the photo on the opposite page, you will notice the rubber hose is crimped to a plastic called polyimide. Evidently that polyimide will last forever, but it has to be replaced because there is no way to connect to it permanently without a hydraulic crimper.

Porsche saved a couple bucks per car by making the part one piece and not putting in a simple screw on type of connector in the front like they did for the rear. Two bucks per car times 100,000 cars is nothing to sneeze at. The only cure is replace the hose, and "while you are in there," it would be nuts not to replace the return line as well. I ordered the lines from an aftermarket supplier and now my car has the screw-on connectors in the front. The new hoses come with a



temporary screw-together connector that is only used for the installation, and you screw the old hose to the new hose, and pull it from rear to front. Discard the old hose, then do it again for the return line using the same connector. The new lines are the same tough polyimide in the tunnel and rubber in the very front, just like the factory hoses except they have a screw on connector. Once the lines are pulled through, the temporary connector is removed and discarded.


A full write up of the process would take most of the War Whoop so I will just refer you to Pelican Parts 911 technical forum, and they have great step-by-step instructions on how other members did it. My part is to fill in some tips that come in handy. The first step is disconnecting the battery, and the second step is to drain all the

gasoline in the tank from the car. Of course I had a nearly full tank of gas. There is no way to drain the gas without spilling some, and having some dribble down your arms. I chose a cool drizzly day with the humidity at near 100% so there is no chance of a static spark. Tie an old rag around your wrists to stop the gas from running down your arm to your armpits. Find a half-inch hose that is long enough to go from the tank connector to the gas cans you have lined up. Remove the old line from the tank to the fuel pump, plug it with your thumb, grab the new hose, and quickly put it on and let it drain. I just swapped the gas cans back and forth and poured the gas into my El Camino tank. Once it quits draining, put a short piece of hose over the tank connection to keep dirt and debris out of the tank.

Getting wrenches on the fitting in the rear is a real challenge. There is not much room to work. Look at the image below and notice the top arrow is the connection to the fuel supply: the middle arrow is pointing at the return line connector, and I have one wrench in place that prevents the line from spinning. I still have to get a wrench on the larger fitting, and somehow apply enough force to break it free and unscrew it. The tip I can provide: get a crow foot end and use a socket wrench. There was no other way to get the force needed. The bottom arrow is the new supply hose for the gas, and where it goes into the tunnel. Until the return line is replaced, there is not enough room to finish the supply side.

All this is only possible when the transmission mount support bar has been removed, and a temporary brace is rigged up to hold the transmission up. The clutch cable has to be disconnected in the rear and moved over to allow room to work. After the old hoses are replaced with the new hoses and everything is connected, the next fun step comes up. Getting the new rubber grommets around the new hoses to keep to tunnel dry, and getting them in place up against the body is difficult. The grommets are vital, since they hold the hoses firmly in place to prevent rubbing on the edge of the tunnel wall.

Looking at the image on the opposite page you can see that very little of the





hose protrudes out the front to give you room to connect the new rubber hoses. Then there is almost no space to place the grommets in the front, but persistence and some lubricant will get them in place. The image on the next page shows the new rubber hoses connected in front.

The entire process took me a whole weekend, and two half days to complete. I skipped over the need to remove the seats, and the center console around the shifter. On a scale of one to ten I would rate it a seven in difficulty but a 10 in the comfort knowing I have all new hoses. And yes, I had already replaced the hoses over the engine a few years ago. Those are best done with the engine out of the car. I plan to drive my 911 to Key West

next year. That will be the fun part of keeping a 33-year old car with 168,000 in top running condition.

In the end, the biggest tip: get a lift in the garage to get enough room under the car to do this project. And air conditioning is great after the fuel is all drained. For an old man like myself, I would never have been able to do the project on a creeper and jack stands. Read and learn what your task is on a great forum like Pelican Parts technical site before you attack this task.

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Parade Notes


