
Port of L.A. update on San Pedro's Waterfront



COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIPS – TIME TO APPLY!

Most Valuable Student (MVS) Program -The 2022 MVS program began on August 2nd. MVS applications are obtained and submitted online at: enf.elks.org/MVS. The deadline to submit is November 15th.

The Elks National Foundation (ENF) will award 500 four-year scholarships based on academics, leadership, and financial need. ENF awards range from \$1,000/yr to \$12,500/yr (for 4 years) and will be announced in March 2022. Lodge 966 provides additional awards at the local level, and students can also earn awards at the district and state levels of the MVS competition.

MVS scholarships are for students pursuing a four-year degree, on a full-time basis (minimum of 12 semester hours), in a U.S. college or university. Eligible applicants include:

Current high school seniors (or equivalent) who are citizens of the United States.

Applicants do not have to be related to a member of the Elks, nor do they have to have an affiliation with Lodge 966.

Male and female students compete separately.

Applications will either be automatically routed to the nearest lodge for judging based on the applicant's residency zip code, or applicants can direct their application to a lodge of their choice. Those wishing to have our Lodge review their application should select San Pedro Lodge 966 on their application.

<u>Legacy Awards</u> - The 2022 Legacy program will begin on September 1st. Legacy awards provide \$4,000 scholarships for children and grandchildren of active Elks members. The ENF will offer a total of 300 awards. Like the MVS program, the Legacy Awards are done entirely online via the ENF website, and the application deadline is February 7, 2022. For more details please visit: enf.elks.org/Leg

BIOGRAPHY OF

THAINE "KEITH" MILLS GRAND EXALTED RULER 2021-2022

Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks of the U.S.A.

Ketth Mills was born on October 17, 1968 in Twin. Falls, Ideho, to Justin and Ruth Mills, the youngest of five children. Keith has three brothers, Randy, Butch, the late Devon, and his sister Cheryl. Keith grew up on the family farm outside Hollister, Idaho. The rural elementary school had about 50 students enrolled through sixth grade. High school was spent in the neighboring town of Filer where Keith participated in almost every sport; football, basketball, track and rodeo. In 1987, he graduated from Filer High School. Congressman Stallings was instrumental in Keith receiving an appointment to the United States Military Academy at West Point for academics and football. Unfortunately, an injury meant Keith returned home in 1989 where he attended the College of Southern Idaho and met Amy Jane Rutherford, his best friend and true love.
