

### EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT: A WHEELCHAIR SWING

Introducing Spencer Baker, an Eagle Scout candidate at Stillwater Area High School. He is starting this fall to plan the 2020 summer installation of a 16' x 24' deck off the upper entry to place a wheelchair swing for the residents. Everyone benefits from swinging! It is an excellent source of vestibular stimulation, which affects balance in the inner ear. It is also fun, and a great way to enjoy the fresh air and views from the house.



Spencer is fundraising over the winter with a goal of \$3500 in materials and an additional \$2000 for the swing. 
Our sensory program got a big boost this summer with the help of our summer intern, Lizzy (photo above). She is a college student who is a neighbor of Granite House and is fascinated with sensory input when used with people who have disabilities. Lizzy volunteered her time by assisting Julie with music therapy and creating a resource notebook and buckets of supplies for targeting specific senses: smell, touch, hearing, taste, and visual.

Lizzy helped us do some special theme days like "beach day" and "Northwoods day," by integrating music sounds, fragrance, objects to touch, and special foods to taste. The staff will be able to use these assembled resources over the winter. We have all enjoyed having Lizzy be part of our team this summer.

Anna started to bring her new dog Archie to Granite House this summer and he is now a beloved regular. He is so calm and friendly to everyone, and the residents and staff have really responded to him. He curls up and naps on our new bean bag chairs with the residents and welcomes staff and visitors.
