

consultant. Tom Insley will work with Chad as the project manager in addition to representing Granite House as their general contractor. With Chad and Tom donating their time, and Granite House acting as the general contractor, we expect some significant savings on the project. We will also be looking for volunteer help for aspects that can accommodate the build.

PROGRESS AT THE PROPERTY • 2114 Stagecoach Trail North, Stillwater, MN



BREAKING GROUND: Some of our generous neighbors on Stagecoach Trail are donating their efforts to Granite House. The excavation will begin May 4 and will be donated by Miller Excavating, with the rock and sand being donated by Aggregate Industries. We also anticipate charitable considerations from several more of our contractors and suppliers, some of them being referred to us by Twin Cities Habitat for Humanity. We hope to have the house "dried in" - windows and doors installed - by the end of June. Watch for updates on our Facebook page and the BUILDING tab on the website.

PROGRESS ON OUR STARTUP FUNDING

Home elevator \$25,000 GOT IT! **Bedroom flooring** \$10,000 GOT IT! Therapy bath \$10,000 GOT IT! Standby generator \$20,000 GOT IT! Ceiling lifts in each bedroom and in the therapy areas are vital to the safety and comfort of our residents. Nursing homes use large lifts called "Hoyers" which require two people and are difficult on some floor surfaces. Ceiling lifts can be easily operated by one aide, can be maneuvered into any part of the room, and are safer for both the patient and the operator.

Fire suppression sprinklers will be installed on both levels to ensure that in an emergency, there is time to get all of our residents to safety. With wheelchair access to the outdoors on both levels, this meets fire code and ensures safety for all, and Bayport Fire & Rescue is only three miles away on Stagecoach Trail.
