GRANITE HOUSE has built a 24-hour community residence in Stillwater, Minnesota, for the long-term care of younger adults with severe and permanent brain injury who might otherwise be in a nursing home. Purpose-built with community support, it opened in November 2018.

He greets everyone at the top of the stairs, gets some good tummy rubs, then cuddles up with residents in their comfy chairs. # SUE FEATURED CAREGIVER

For over 15 years, Sue has been a caregiver and teacher for people with disabilities. She worked as a job coach, paraprofessional and Special Education Teacher for the Hudson, WI School District prior to her position at Granite House. Taking an interest in one of her students, Sue became an in-home aide for her and continues to spend one day a week with her. She has also volunteered on numerous occasions for Bridge For Community Life, a disability support organization in St. Croix County, WI. Sue is a native of the St. Paul-Maplewood area but has lived across the river in Hudson, WI for over 20 years. She found out about Granite House from a former resident's family member and is approaching her three-year anniversary this fall. Sue is always willing to pick up extra shifts and work overtime to cover when needed. When she has any free time, she hangs out with her two adult children, sometimes working alongside her daughter who is also a caregiver, in addition to outdoor summer activities and playing piano. It is the personal interactions with residents, and the family feeling at Granite House that has kept her part of our team.

# NOTE FROM THE STAFF

2022 was a challenging year for the Granite House staff. Those of us with experience in long-term care understand the inevitable patient losses, and losing two residents within five months was heartbreaking for everyone. It was inspirational to see how our caregivers stayed on task with cheerful faces while each of the two residents were home on hospice care during their last days. The staff comforted the residents, the family members and each other. Everyone wanted to take time off to attend the Celebration of Life in both cases, to show their respect and extend their sympathy to the families. As leaders we are so proud of them, as we make every effort to find joy each day with our current residents. Holiday and birthday treats, outings and picnics, bonuses, massages and just a sincere "thank you" at the end of each shift are ways to show our appreciation to this amazing group. It is a big help to have our donor funds available to cover these extra program costs, to provide a pleasant, welcoming workplace that feels like home. Thank you! .....


### **GARDEN PLANS**
