

Main floor plan: Four bedrooms, office and staff areas, and breakout room for private family gatherings. Great room with fireplace, large screened porch, eat-in kitchen and accessible bath. Patio with flower beds at main entry and elevator to lower level. Lower level: Physical therapy, hydrotherapy, storage, laundry, staff room and garage entry.

GRANITE HOUSE is building a 24-hour sustainable community residence in Stillwater, Minnesota, for the long-term care of young adults who would otherwise be in a nursing home.

PURPOSE: Provide an environment and social interactions that enrich the lives of individuals with severe brain injury.

You can just see the distant river bluffs on the Wisconsin side of the St. Croix River in the lower right of the photo. We will work with the Washington County Master Gardeners and the county Watershed District to restore and preserve the oak savannah and prairie areas. Plans for 2017-2018 include a sensory garden for the enjoyment of the residents.

FEATURES OF THE RESIDENCE

- Private rooms with a view of the woods
- Ceiling lifts in bedrooms for transfers
- Wide hallways and entry doors
- Great room with fireplace
- Large three-season screened porch
- Outdoor patio with plantings
- Breakout room for private family visits or community meetings
- Elevator to lower level therapy suite
- Roll-in shower and hydrotherapy tub
