

# **Snow Impacts Expected**

#### **Friday through Friday Night**

## **Key Messages:**

#### **Winter Storm Warning**


- → In effect for the Sierra Madre and Snowy Ranges until 5 AM Saturday.
- → Additional snow accumulations of 8 to 16 inches.
- → Heavy snow and strong gusty winds expected.

#### **Winter Weather Advisory**

- → In effect for portions of southeast Wyoming from 5 AM until 11 PM Friday.
- → Up to 3 inches of snow accumulation possible.
- → Blowing and drifting snow possible.

#### **Snow Squalls Possible**

- → Snow squalls possible on Friday. Best area for occurrence is along the Interstate-80 corridor.
- → Snow squalls could significantly reduce visibility and create hazardous travel.





## **Snow Amount Probabilities Through Friday Night**

### Probability of Exceeding 1" (left) and 4" (right)



- → Up to 3 inches possible for most locations.
- → Light, fluffy, blowable snow due to very cold temperatures.
- → Possibility for snow squalls across the area on Friday, however, best area for occurrence is along the Interstate-80 corridor. Snow squalls could significantly reduce visibility and create slick roads and hazardous travel.
- → Light snow to continue through Monday.





## **High Winds Possible Across Southeast WY**

January 11, 2024 3:22 PM

**High Winds Late Tonight through Friday** 

### **Hazard Details**




High Wind Warning in effect from 11 PM tonight through 5 PM Friday.



In effect for portions of southeast Wyoming, including the wind prones. Possible expansion of the Warning to other locations.

### Wind Impacts:

- → Wind gusts up to 60 MPH for the plains. Wind gusts up to 70 MPH for the wind prone areas.
- → Areas of blowing snow could significantly reduce visibility.
- → Blow off and blowover risk.
- → Snow squalls possible along the Interstate-80 corridor.






## **Maximum Wind Gusts**

**Thursday Night Through Friday** 

#### **Wind Gust Details**

- → Wind Prone Areas of Arlington/Elk Mountain & Bordeaux: West winds 30 to 40 mph with gusts 60 to 70 MPH.
- → Additional Warning Areas, including Rawlins, Laramie, Saratoga, and Cheyenne: West winds 30 to 40 mph with gusts up to 60 MPH.
- → Expansion of the Warning to other locations is possible!
- → Blow offs and blowovers of light weight and high profile vehicles could occur. Areas of blowing snow possible in areas with a blowable snowpack.







# Dangerously Cold Temperatures


#### **Friday Through Tuesday Morning**

#### **Hazard Details**

- → Wind Chill Warning in effect from 5 PM Friday through 6 AM Monday.
  - ◆ In effect for the Laramie Range and areas eastward, including the Nebraska panhandle.
  - Wind Chills as low as -60°F for areas north of the North Platte River Valley.
  - Wind Chills as low as -45°F for areas south of the North Platte River Valley.

### **Cold Impacts:**

- Dangerously cold wind chills could cause frostbite on exposed skin in as little as 10 minutes.
- → Avoid activities outside, if possible.
- → If you must be outdoors, where appropriate clothing and dress in layers.






# Dangerous Cold Through Tuesday Morning

**Wind Chill and Wind Timeline** 

## **Key Messages**

- → Extremely dangerous, life threatening wind chill values are expected Friday night through potentially Tuesday morning.
- → Coldest wind chills are currently expected Saturday morning through Monday morning.





### **Record Overnight Low Temperatures Possible**

→ Record cold low temperatures possible in the panhandle Saturday, Sunday and Monday morning.

Minimum Wind Chill Forecast (°F)
Created: 2 pm MST Thu 1/11/2024 | Values are minimums over the period beginning at the time shown


→ Overnight lows could drop as low as -30°F.

Dangerous winter weather is expected within the next 12 to 36 hours or is occurring. Considerable travel problems are expected.

take action.

## Winter Weather Advisory

Potentially dangerous winter weather is expected within the next 12 to 36 hours or is occurring. **Travel difficulties** are expected.
