## Saturday through Sunday

## Key Messages

$\rightarrow$ Confidence is increasing for a significant winter storm impacting portions of the area Saturday through early Monday morning.
$\rightarrow$ The Pine Ridge (US-20 corridor) and the North Laramie Range have the highest probability of significant impacts.
$\rightarrow$ Strong winds are also increasingly likely with this storm.

## $\rightarrow$ Winter Storm Watch

- In effect for the North Laramie Range from 6 AM Saturday until 6 AM Monday. Heavy snow is possible with accumulations of 12 or more inches. Winds could gust as high as 75 MPH.
- In effect for Converse, Niobrara, northern Sioux, and Dawes Counties from 3 PM Saturday until 6 AM Monday. Blizzard conditions possible! Snow accumulations of 6 to 12 inches with higher amounts possible along the Pine Ridge. Winds could gust up to 55 MPH, reducing visibility due to blowing and drifting snow.
$\rightarrow$ High Wind Watch
- In effect for the SE Wyoming wind prone areas from 6 AM Saturday until 3 PM Sunday. Wind gusts up to 75 MPH possible.
- In effect for Laramie and Kimball Counties from 12 PM Saturday until 3 PM Sunday. Wind gusts up to 70 MPH possible.

## Wind Gust Timeline

$\rightarrow \quad$ West winds 40 to 50 MPH with gusts to 75 MPH possible for the wind prone areas of Arlington/Elk Mountain, Bordeaux, and the Interstate 80 summit.
$\rightarrow \quad$ Northwest winds 35 to 45 MPH with gusts up to 70 MPH possible for Laramie and Kimball Counties.
$\rightarrow$ Areas outside of the current watches will still see strong, gusty winds!
$\rightarrow$ High Wind Watches may be extended to other locations!
$\rightarrow$ Strong cross winds will be hazardous to light weight or high profile vehicles, including campers and tractor trailers.
$\rightarrow$ Strong winds could also lead to areas of blowing and drifting snow, reducing visibility.

## Probability of Exceeding 2" (left) and 6" (right)


$\rightarrow$ Highest snowfall totals will be in the high terrain, including the Pine Ridge, as well as Niobrara and Converse Counties.
$\rightarrow$ Blizzard conditions could be possible, especially in Niobrara County and along the Pine Ridge.
$\rightarrow$ Still some uncertainty in snowfall amounts as models are not in full agreement with how fast this storm vacates the area. Snowfall amounts will also depend on when rain will transition to snow.
