The Acacia tree was found in the area now known as Palestine during ancient times, but today it is found all over Africa. It looks like the mulberry tree and can grow to well over one hundred feet tall. The gum obtained from it is known as Arabic. Acacia is a very hard, and sacred Hebrew wood known in the scriptures as "Shittah." The Ark of the Covenant was made from it. Acacia is part of our Master Mason ritual and represents the immortality of the soul, as the soul lives on after our bodies have been put to rest. It can be a bush, a tree, or a grove of trees. FROM THE DESK OF THE SECRETARY


