Insurance Agent Report:

Every Penny Counts!

I know times are tight for everyone; both in available time and the impacts of inflation. Protecting financial security isn't always about the long term (especially now). Providing a higher quality at a lower price makes this more of an education job rather than sales...

Group insurance is great, but it may also be more expensive depending on your situation. Dangerously, it can lack the guarantees most of us expect for our loved ones. Wonderful supplement, terrible foundation. The existence of this coverage might convince someone that personally owned life insurance is not necessary.

Most group life insurance policies are limited in amount, which may be tied to salary or some other benchmark. These numbers are often capped, and this cap may be dangerously low when compared to your family's actual needs. In fact, a detailed needs analysis that evaluates your specific situation, will likely show that any employer-provided coverage falls short.
