

♥ IMPORTANT INSTRUCTIONS FOR YOUR NEW FURBABY

FOOD	Life's Abundance All Stages Grain Free Food	ORDER HERE: https://lifesabundance.com/Sactolabradoodles	Your new baby eats three times a day: breakfast, lunch and dinner. The amount to feed them PER DAY is written on the back of the bag, so you will need to divide that amount by 3 for each meal. If your puppy wants more food, you can give them more – they are growing and typically will not overeat. NOTE: Food that you can buy in a Grocery Store is typically NOT a great quality food, but you can change him to whatever you prefer as well. If you do change food, mix a bit of the new food with the current food gradually to avoid stomach upset, over 7 days time.
WATER		Your puppy only needs about 1 OUNCE of water per day per pound of body weight. NO WATER after about 7PM at night to help with potty training.	Giving your puppy a full bowl of water can give them loose stool, create a mess for you AND make it impossible to potty train them! Try putting a bit of water in the bowl with their kibble for a while, as they will get BOTH at one time, rather than filling up on water alone.

CRATE TRAINING		When purchasing a crate, it should be just big enough for the puppy/dog to stand up, turn around a lie down, or they may potty on one side, and sleep on the other! A 24 inch crate is plenty big enough for a puppy, and later, you may have to upsize. <i>30-40 inch will be large enough for your full grown furbaby.</i>	CRATE TRAINING is suggested by most all trainers and breeders, as it will also become the puppy's "safe place." It also helps tremendously with potty training, as well as provides a safe place for the puppy in your absence. If you are getting an older puppy or adult, hopefully they are potty trained already, but remember that is still takes doggies time to adjust to their new surroundings, and a new routine.
VACCINATIONS		Please refer to the vaccination record, to ensure you have scheduled your first exam and vaccinations in a timely manner.	You can request this record from your breeder.
SOCIALIZING & SAFETY		100 faces in 100 days! That's the goal for your new pup. Take to as many safe places as possible and have your puppy meet as many people as possible.	The first 14 weeks of your puppy's life are essential for the development of confidence and tolerance.
GROOMING		Metal Comb: (your choice) Brush: Chris Christensen Baby G Dog Brush Grooming Scissors: Blunt tip eye scissors, Straight, Thinning Cutting Shears and Comb	Daily/Weekly care of your doodle's coat is essential! Brush daily (down to the skin – not just surface). Keep hair clean and blow dry!! Keep eye hair plucked, eye hairs cut and nails trimmed each week! Refer to the ALAA & WALA Grooming Cards for tips.
