AREAS WHERE PADDLING IS NOT PERMITTED

All kayakers and paddleboarders must stay well clear of the HM Naval Base at Devonport, (red shaded area on the map) the refuelling supply depot at Torpoint, and the armaments depot at Ernesettle. When paddling on the River Tamar, please paddle on the Cornwall side of the river (the western side). Please be aware that there are three chain car ferries operating between Devonport and Torpoint, and DO NOT paddle in front of the ferry, wait for the ferry to pass. DO NOT LAND ON ANY PASSENGER FERRY PONTOON.

AREAS WHERE PADDLING IS PERMITTED

Please keep to the green line areas shown on the map. When paddling around Drake's Island, please be aware that seals and other wild animals live in the waters surrounding the island, and nesting birds on the island itself. You are permitted to land on the beach on the northern side of the island. Landing on the rest of the island is not permitted. There is an area of extremely important seagrass on the southern side of the island, where you may paddle through, but please do not damage the seagrass in any way. Do not hand feed any wild animal. Always watch for boat traffic in the shipping Lane indicated by the yellow line on the map. When landing, only use public slipways, public pontoons and beaches.

WATCH THE WEATHER

If the weather is looking like it is getting worse, please do not hesitate to paddle back to your launch location and call TK Watersports control on 07462 427327 for advice.

CAPSIZING RECOVERY

Should you be unfortunate to fall off your kayak or paddleboard, don't panic. Simply flip the kayak or paddleboard the correct way up and climb back on from the side. Your paddle should be connected to the boat with the leash provided.
