2022 Community Health Needs Assessment

Overview

The 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) was performed in collaboration between F.W. Huston Medical Center (FWH) and the Jefferson County Health Department (JCHD). The entire area of Jefferson County was included in the community as defined by the CHNA. Information for the CHNA was obtained primarily through a 33-question survey available online via SurveyMonkey and in printed paper survey format from August 2022 through mid-November 2022.

The survey had 86 respondents with 76 completing online and 10 via paper form. Respondents ranged in age from 18 to over 65 years. All towns in Jefferson County were represented except for Grantville. Eighty-four percent of respondents were female and 96.51% were Not Hispanic/Latino. The survey approached concerns from both the personal and community-wide level; therefore, respondents reported both concerns specific to their households and perceived concerns for the community at large.

Results

The following show the top four concerns identified for the four different age categories:
