FROM THE BWRC PRESIDENT

I am worried. I believe there are local issues that Democrats could make worse. We have some influence on national election results, but we can decide local outcomes. We need to elect Republican candidates up and down the ballot in both August and November by volunteering our time and financial support.

Local:

- We've been fighting to remove extreme ideology from schools and demanding they stop withholding information about children from their parents. - Pinellas County Commissioners determine how a \$4 billion budget is spent. Currently, there is a slim majority of Republican-affiliated commissioners. We must support all conservative Commission candidates on the November ballot to strengthen our majority.

State:

- We need to continue to stop the sale of land to China, to fight illegal immigration and to hold ground with voting improvements.
- Insurance issues continue to plague Florida citizens.

Had it not been for Republican legislators, the Biden regime would have taken a stronger hold in Florida. Never take these legislators for granted and don't miss an opportunity to retain them and increase our conservative majority in Tallahassee.

National:

 Anna Paulina Luna is a strong, award-winning, conservative woman in Congress who is being challenged by Democrats with support from local Democrats. Local Democrats are working together against conservative values as an active political force. We need to do the same!

Florida GOP Takes Stance On Proposed Florida Constitutional Amendments

At its quarterly meeting in May, the Republican Party of Florida Executive Board unanimously passed a resolution opposing proposed Florida Constitution amendments 3 and 4 and supporting the balance of the proposed Constitutional amendments that will appear on the November 2024 ballot. The six proposed amendments are:

- ♦ Amendment 1 Partisan Election of Members of District School Boards
- Amendment 2 Right to Fish and Hunt
- Amendment 3 Adult Personal Use of Marijuana
- ♦ Amendment 4 Limit Government Interference with Abortions
- Amendment 5 Annual Adjustment to the Value of Certain Homestead Exemptions
- Amendment 6 Repeal of Public Campaign Financing Requirement
