Wilton Simpson, Florida Agriculture Commissioner, to speak at March luncheon



The speaker at Belleair Women's Republican Club's luncheon on March 1 will be Wilton Simpson, Florida's 13th Commissioner of Agriculture. Simpson is a fifth-generation Floridian and is proud to have been born and raised in the Sunshine State. A lifelong farmer and entrepreneur, Simpson has deep roots grounded in agriculture. For over four decades, he owned and managed a large-scale egg-laying operation that supplied families across the state.

As Commissioner of Agriculture Commissioner, Simpson oversees the FL Department of Agriculture and Consumer Services. With his background in agriculture, he clearly understands the challenges faced by Florida's farmers. During his first legislative session as Commissioner of Agriculture, he made to protect them. Securing the future of Florida agriculture, prioritizing Florida-grown food, defending second amendment rights, and — most importantly— defining agriculture as a national security issue in Florida were among his top priorities upon taking office.

His legislative service and history of community involvement also positions Simpson to guide the department's other equally important roles, such as protecting the environment, ensuring the availability, safety and affordability of the food supply and advocating for Florida consumers.

From 2012 to 2022, Commissioner Simpson served as a member of the Florida Senate and was elected Senate President for the 2020-2022 term. many unique challenges, but Simpson fought to keep Florida open and free and to ensure that Florida was a beacon of hope. opportunity and freedom for generations to come. Throughout his tenure in the Senate, Commissioner Simpson was a staunch advocate for Florida agriculture and proud farmers and ranchers. He was instrumental in securing historic funding for the industry and crucial protections like the Right to Farm Act and Florida Wildlife Corridor Act.

Commissioner Simpson lives in Pasco County with his wife Kathy. Their son Wilton Jr. and his wife Caroline are practically neighbors, as are Commissioner Simpson's daughter Lauran, her husband Kenten, and their daughters. Among his many accomplishments,

- 2. Luncheon reservations are required. To secure a seat, mail a check for \$37 payable to "BWRC" to the P.O. Box address shown in the newsletter. Timely receipt of your check, at least seven days prior to the luncheon, allows club treasurers to fulfill their obligation to provide Belleair Country Club with our "head count" for the event by a certain date. The country club staff needs this information in time to properly arrange seating and prepare food. If you are requesting a vegetarian lunch, please indicate "vegetarian meal" on the blank memo line of your check. The club is billed based on the head count. To cancel a paid reservation, email as soon as possible to Jessica Reed at jessicareed6462@ me.com or Louise Davis at Idavis300@icloud. com. We will try to apply your payment to another month.
- 3. When you arrive at the luncheon, please be sure to check in at the desk. It is important we all wear a nametag with first and last names.
- 4. Seating at the luncheon has been challenging at times. I have been meeting with the Belleair Country Club staff to improve the process. After checking in, please select your seat, but do not save seats for others who have not arrived. The only seats that will be saved are those at the speaker and new member tables. The speaker table will include members and guests who need easy access to the podium. The new member table will provide a space for new members to meet other new members and make sure they are welcomed and briefly oriented by our new member committee team.
- 5. In the past, Belleair Country Club and BWRC members have been allowed to save seats for others. This practice can no longer be accommodated for any
