Lt. Governor Jay Collins to speak at BWRC luncheon

How do you follow the spectacular Belleair Women's Republican Club October luncheon where the state's governor was the featured speaker? Well, BWRC did not have to look far away from the governor's office to find its November special guest. BWRC is once again very honored to announce the speaker at the November 7 luncheon will be Florida's 21st Lieutenant Governor, Jay Collins, who was appointed to the position by Governor Ron DeSantis on August 12, 2025. His duties include serving as acting governor in the absence or disability of the governor and performing tasks assigned by the Governor such as overseeing specific departments or projects.

Florida Lieutenant Governor (LG) Jay Collins is a highly decorated Army Special Forces combat veteran who sustained a number of debilitating injuries that led to the loss of his leg. Remarkably, he continued to serve five additional years as a Green Beret post-amputation, ultimately retiring after more than 23 years of service.

Following his military service, LG Collins took a position with Operation BBQ Relief, overseeing the distribution of millions of meals to Americans following natural disasters and helping veterans and their families by creating culinary delights together. Through his nonprofit work, he heard the concerns of Americans, Americans who want their families to succeed, and their children to have better lives than they did. With this in mind, Jay Collins took the chance and answered the call to public service by running for Florida State Senate, in District 14.

During his tenure as a Florida State Senator, Collins distinguished himself through strategic leadership and legislative impact. As Chair of the Agricultural and Transportation committees, he championed



infrastructure initiatives vital to Florida's economic connections. As a Senator, Collins authored and passed over 55 pieces of legislation and secured more than \$120 million in funding to uplift the Tampa Bay region, support Florida's First Responders and Veterans and invest in premier educational institutions. His proven record of results and vision for Florida's future culminated in his appointment as the 21st Lieutenant Governor of the State of Florida.

A committed family man, Collins has been married to his wife Layla, a retired veteran with 20 years of service in her own right, for 25 years. They have two young sons, Gabe and Colt.

The November luncheon will be a private event for members of BWRC and their personal guests whose names must be submitted with the member's payment. Please do not share information about the luncheon on social media. There will be no walk-ins allowed, and members are advised to reserve a seat early as space is limited and likely to sell out.

DAY TO REMEMBER

For the first time in Belleair Women's Republican Club's 60 years, the state's governor came to call, and it was a very special day indeed. Governor Ron DeSantis honored BWRC by speaking at the October luncheon to a large and enthusiastic crowd. The club managed to seat 253 persons, a record number of attendees, one of whom was also an honored guest, the Governor's dad Ron DeSantis Sr.

Anticipation built as everyone waited for the Governor to arrive, and finally, after a few quick pictures with the BWRC Board, he entered the dining room to a standing ovation. Quickly called to the podium, he spoke for nearly an hour, outlining his accomplishments during his time in office. At the conclusion of his presentation he was joined at the podium by Pinellas County Board of Commissioners Chairman Brian Scott who presented him with a key to the County in recognition of the aid he provided Pinellas after last year's hurricanes.

BWRC membership dues for 2026 are now being collected

Pay \$30 by cash, check or Zelle

The Belleair Women's Republican Executive Committee has voted to set membership dues for 2026 at \$30, a modest \$5 increase over the amount paid for 2025. Club dues have not been raised in several years. With the cost of goods and services continuing to rise, Executive Committee members felt the dues increase is necessary to insure the club can continue to function at a high level, meet its goals and objectives and provide members with a quality experience.

2026 dues are to be paid on or before January 1, 2026. Members can either send a check for \$30 or process a \$30 payment through Zelle. With the holiday season rapidly approaching, it is recommended dues be sent as soon as possible so the need to do so is not overlooked during the busy coming months.

With the 2026 elections in sight, the club needs all of its members to stay active and connected. There is work to do! Failure to pay on time can lead to a member being dropped from the club's membership roster and contact lists. This means communication from the club will cease and opportunities to participate in certain club activities will no longer be possible.

The fiscal year of Belleair Women's Republican Club runs January 1 through December 31. The BWRC Bylaws stipulate membership dues must be paid for the coming year on or before January 1.
