November General Election candidates to speak in October

While much attention is focused on the Presidential race in November's election, there are a Pinellas County. number of other important contests Pinellas County voters will find on their ballots. A good number of General Election Republican candidates have already appeared and spoken at a Belleair Women's Republican Club event, but there are a few remaining GOP office seekers who have not yet had that opportunity.

The second photo shows Rep. Kim Berfield, who is running for a second term in the Florida House as the representative for District 58. District 58 encompasses a central section of Pinellas County.

The third photo shows Rep. Linda Chaney, who is seeking a second term in the Florida House as the representative for District 61. District 61 encompasses a south- section of Hillsborough County. west section of Pinellas County.

The fourth photo shows Rep. Berny Jacques, who is seeking a second term in the Florida House as the representative for District 59. District 59 encompasses a central section of Pinellas County.

The fifth picture shows Vince Nowicki, who is running for the District 3 seat on the Pinellas County Commission. District 3

encompasses a southeast section of Pinellas County.

The sixth photo shows Chris Scherer, who is running for the District 1 seat on the Pinellas County Commission. District 1 encompasses a northeast section of Pinellas County.
