Our well-equipped nursery is open for children 3 yrs and younger, and our exciting Children's Chapel Program welcomes Grades Pre-K through Grade 5.

Music

We are very blessed at Christ the King to have the most beautiful Pilcher Pipe Organ built by Henry Pilcher's sons of Louisville, Kentucky in the 1920's.

The glorious sound of the pipe organ accompanies the choir and fills the church at the 10:00am worship service.

We are equally blessed to have a young, enthusiastic and exceptionally talented part-time music director, Mr. Tim Smale.

Tim joined Christ the King just over a year ago and directs our small but dedicated choir. We are excited that he is already expanding our music program.

Acolyte Guild

The Acolyte Guild is comprised mainly of our youth led by an Acolyte Master. The philosophy of the Acolyte Guild is to encourage our youth from age eleven through high school to make a meaningful commitment to servant ministry.

Altar Guild

Our Altar Guild's members work diligently and quietly behind the scenes to ensure the altar is prepared for our Lord's Supper. In teams of three to four, the members of the Guild serve once every four weeks.



Usher Corps

Christ the King's faithful ushers welcome visitors and members of our congregation every Sunday with a warm greeting. They distribute bulletins and the order of service, as well as carry out traditional duties of an usher in presenting the sacraments and collecting the offering. In addition, some of our very young members help with the basket to collect food for HAAM,

Children's Chapel

Children ARE our future! On a Sunday morning during the 10am service our Children, aged Pre-K to Grade 5, leave the congregation and gather for a lesson that is in line with the week's Bible readings.

We ensure that this is not only a time to learn about God, Jesus and the Bible, but also a joyful and fun time where children grow together within our community.

The lesson is accompanied by a craft that emphasizes the message for the week so that our youngsters have a positive experience that they are eager to share with their families.

They are taught by a retired teacher and volunteers from our congregation. We love the vibrancy of our children and love to see them grow spiritually.

Have Shears Will Travel

Have Shears Will Travel is a nonprofit organization founded by one of our members, Barbara Goodson, in 2015. Each month over 700 free haircuts are provided to the homeless, hospitalized or in hospice care, displaced families, children or those suffering from substance abuse or domestic violence, bringing a sense of dignity to this neglected community.

Breakfast With Santa

For 13 years, we've been proud to host Breakfast with Santa, an annual event that takes place on the second Saturday of December. This collaborative community gathering is supported by private, government, and charitable organizations.

Breakfast is served to all, and there are games and activities for the kids, arts and crafts, and a free photo with Santa.

Humble Area Assistance Ministries (HAAM)

Christ the King was a founding member of Humble Area Assistance Ministries in 1990. HAAM was established to meet the growing demand in the Humble, Atascocita and Kingwood communities to help the needy with food, shelter, clothing, transportation and other emergencies.

Churches United in Caring (CUIC)

Churches United in Caring was established in 1984 with the help of Christ the King. It is a coalition of churches in the Crosby – Huffman area organized to provide food pantry relief to those in crisis need.

Lord of the Streets (LOTS)

Christ the King is proud to be a support church of Lord of the Streets Episcopal Church, which ministers to the homeless in downtown Houston. Our church members consider this an important outreach and periodically serve breakfast to the homeless following Sunday morning services at Lord of the Streets

Hurricanes

Our Gulf Coast is known for hurricanes and Christ the King always steps up to help with disaster relief. Following Hurricane Rita we partnered with Holy Trinity Episcopal in Dickinson, TX agreeing to shelter the parishioners of Holy Trinity in the event of inclement weather.

In 2017 Hurricane Harvey devastated our area and 8 families from our own congregation sustained serious damage to their homes. Our wonderful members mobilized immediately, helping to rip out sheetrock and serve food as our crews worked.


Our Parish and Community

Christ the King is located in the suburb of Atascocita northeast of Houston, Texas. However, the expanded area in which parishioners live encompasses a much larger geography.

Most of the members of Christ the King reside in Atascocita, but approximately 25% of the households are located well outside of Atascocita, with 1/5 living 10 or more miles from Christ the King. Atascocita and adjacent Kingwood are sought after communities in the Houston area.

Atascocita's population has nearly doubled in size between 2005 and 2020 – from 46,390 to 70,704. The growth has been in both single family and multi-family housing, and in families and singles.

The housing in Atascocita is predominately single family (88%) with a few apartment complexes and Senior Living developments, which include Assisted Living and Memory Care as well as independent living.




Age of Atascocita's population

While Atascocita has experienced rapid growth in the past 30 years, there is still a considerable amount of undeveloped and park land throughout the area.

We have several golf courses and country clubs, many with tennis and pickle ball courts. There are neighborhood parks and pools throughout the area as well as large public parks, including a large facility with several baseball fields. In addition, there are several public marinas and numerous areas for fishing.

Atascocita is in close proximity to Humble and Kingwood where there are a number of excellent medical practices and hospitals. Memorial Hermann NE and HCA's Kingwood Hospital are both within 10 miles of the Church. There is a plethora of emergency care centers within a 2 mile radius of the Church. Two major oncology centers are located nearby – one in Humble and one in Kingwood. Virtually every medical specialty is represented with excellent doctors who take most medical insurance.



Atascocita's median household income is \$107,633, considerably higher than Houston's median of \$60,426. Atascocita's median household income also exceeds that of the neighboring communities with the exception of the east side of Kingwood, due north of Atascocita.

The Parishioners of Christ the King have a very similar income distribution as Atascocita.

Christ the King has a well-educated parishioner base. While 14% of Atascocita's population over the age of 24 have graduate degrees, 32% of Christ the King's adult survey respondents have graduate degrees, with another 7% having some post-graduate education.

Of Atascocita's population over the age of 24, 30% have only a high school diploma or less, while 7% of Christ the King's adult survey respondents have less than a high school diploma, and some of those may be under the age of 25.
