1. **Anne Constable**¹⁻⁴, daughter of Francis Constable and Alice Agnes Owen, was born on 21 Feb 1622 in London, England⁴. She died on 06 Oct 1706 in Dividing Creek, Northumberland, Virginia, United States⁴. She married **Richard Lee Col** in 1641 in Jamestown, Virginia, USA. He was born in 1617 in Nordley Regis, Shropshire, England⁵⁻⁷. He died on 01 Mar 1664 in Dividing Creek, Northumberland, VA, USA⁸⁻⁹.

Records show Anne and Richard met on the voyage from England to America, and she is buried next to Richard, even though she did remarry after Richard's death, which was prudent of most widows of that time. Her parentage has been proven by the fact that her parents sent Anne away to escape a certain death from the plague if she stayed in London, for Anne lost both her parents shortly after her departure, then later, Richard sent for the only two other remaining siblings of 9 Constable children that had been taken by the plague, after he married Anne. The fact that Anne was sent as a ward of the King to the America's with such prominence shows her family was of uncommon origins, and that marriage of Richard and Anne did most certainly take place in Jamestown, 2 years after Richard began courting Anne, and it is because of Anne's connections, it is believed that Richard Lee climbed the political ladder so rapidly.[1]

Will probate Aug 1647 Peculiar of the Dean and Chapter of Westminster Francis and Alice Constable were the parents of fifteen Children, four sons and eleven daughters:

Anne, bapt. St. Gregory by St.Paul 21 February 1621/2. She was not among those who presented her mother's will for probate but this may mean only that she was already out of the country. John Gibbon, who had lived with the Lee family in Virginia, stated that Anne Constable was the wife of (Col.) Richard Lee:[2]

The surname of Madam Lee was Constable but she came into Virginia with Sir Francis Wiat and had lived with Sir Jno Thorowgood one of the Gentle-men pensioners

In the year 1640 Richard Henry Lee married at Jamestown, Anne Constable(c. 1621-1666), daughter of Francis Constable and a ward of Sir John Thoroughgood, a personal attendant of Charles I, King of England (1600-1649). She had accompanied the family of Virginia Governor Sir Francis Wyatt (1575-1644), and at the time of her marriage to Richard, she was residing at the Wyatt household in Jamestown. This affiliation soon helped Richard move socially upward within the Colony. In 1643 the new Governor, Sir William Berkeley (1606-1677) appointed Richard Attorney General of the Colony. In addition he served as High Sheriff and was Colonel in the Militia.

Of incalculable importance to his progress was Richard's fortunate marriage. When the young man accompanied Governor Wyatt to Jamestown, the official household also included a young woman, Anne Constable, whose identity later became lost to the family record. Even her name was unknown for two hundred years. Now, thanks to particularly to the work of David Halle, genealogist for the Society of the Lees of Virginia, we know that Anne was baptized in London during 1622 and that she was one of many daughters born to Francis Constable. Perhaps because of her father's connections, Anne became a ward of Sir John Thorowgood, a personal attendant upon King

Charles I. This affiliation would have made it easy for her to know the family of Sir Francis Wyatt and to accompany them to North America. Anne's background and early associations meant that Richard Lee moved socially upward when she took him as husband.

There is a legend which speaks of Richard and Anne being wed in the new brick church at Jamestown during 1641 or 1642, with Governor Wyatt giving the bride away. Anne's decision to marry may have owed something to King Charles's impatience with Governor Wyatt for being unable to reduce long-standing political bickering in Virginia. In 1641 the Crown summoned Sir Francis home, appointing in his stead Sir William Berkeley, who arrived at Jamestown during February 1642. Instead of returning to England with the Wyatt entourage, Miss Constable evidently preferred life in the colony as young Richard Lee's wife.

Richard Lee and his young wife, Anne Constable, who was born in London and may have come to America at the same time as Richard, were parents to an ever-increasing brood of children. In quick succession, between 1645 and 1656, Anne delivered at least ten children, including two girls and six boys that survived infancy - John, Richard, Francis, William, Hancock, Elizabeth, Anne, and Charles. In a short time Lee began to prosper; with prosperity came the ability to cultivate more tobacco fields; with increased cultivation came more prosperity and the ability to supplement his land holdings. His tobacco plantation eventually grew to 1,500 acres and became home to seventeen laborers - indentured servants who paid for their voyage from England to Virginia with seven years of service in Lee's tobacco fields. More importantly, prosperity brought Lee prestige, and with it political appointments:

Clerk of the Quarter Court in 1641;
Attorney General in 1643;
Sheriff and Burgess of York County in 1646 and 1647;
Secretary of State in 1649; and the
Governor's Council in 1651.

As Secretary of State, Lee was the most valuable assistant to the colony's royal governor, Sir William Berkeley (whose estate Green Spring was later inherited by one of Lee's descendants), and the most powerful man in the colony after Berkeley. As a member of the Governor's Council Lee set a precedent for his offspring, who in succeeding generations occupied a seat on the Council until it was dissolved in 1776.

Re: New Research on the Wraysbury Deeds by Alan Nicholls.

In 1999 I gave a presentation to the Lee Society of Virginia at their AGM concerning the English ancestry of Colonel Richard Lee, the founder of the Virginia Lee family. This presentation was placed on my webpage on 24th May 1999.

In that presentation I included evidence that Colonel Richard Lee had signed a series of three indentures relating to a purchase by John Lee of Coton of a property at Wraysbury in Buckinghamshire, England in 1652. Colonel Richard's signature on these deeds had been used by all previous researchers, with other evidence, to show a direct connection between the Lee family of Virginia and the Coton Lee family of Alveley, Shropshire. However since the 1999 presentation my research has revealed evidence using only original contemporary documents that these indentures were in fact signed by Richard Lee, fishmonger, son of Lancelot Lee of Coton. This Richard was the apprentice of John Lee, fishmonger, citizen of London and gentleman. I have shown previously that this John Lee (1600-1682), son of Thomas Lee of Coton (1560-1620) was mistakenly identified as a saddler by all earlier researchers.

As I reported in the 1999 presentation the signatures on the Wraysbury deeds seemed to match extremely well with those few other original signatures of Colonel Richard Lee that I had found. He signed himself Rich: Lee in all cases and I found these signatures the most persuasive evidence to authenticate his claim to a Coton ancestry. However this new evidence has overturned those conclusions. The new research is detailed below.

The research undertaken since the 1999 presentation has not found the English ancestor of Colonel Richard Lee but it is challenging the fundamental assumptions made by earlier researchers. I am continuing to follow my lines of research and hopefully will carry it through to a successful conclusion. I will post articles on my webpage as I complete each phase of the research. As with all research of this nature there are gains and losses but I view each reversal

with a positive attitude that will propel me forward with new knowledge to more gains and, hopefully, less losses.

Jim,

I have not done English research on Richard and Henry Lee of York. They were obviously related, probably brothers. Since Richard was born c. 1619, and appears to have been the older, it would appear that Henry was born c. 1620. Since his first child was b. 1645, this fits well.

There were several Richard Lees and several Henry Lees on the early emigration records. To my knowledge, no one has proven whence they came or which county they settled in.

The first problem in research is that there is no proof that Richard Lee of York was the same person as Col. Richard.

The research that has been done has been aimed at the origin of Col. Richard Lee. Two of the most recognized articles are: Article by Wm. Thorndale, National Genealogical Society Qtrly, Dec 1988

Article by Ludwell Lee Montague, Va. Magazine, Jan. 1954.

The descendants of Col. Richard have not enthusiastically accepted any of the research done. One of them has recently engaged an English researcher, Alan Nicholls. Nicholls has a web page which you can Google up.

Notes for Francis Constable:

Francis Constable was baptized at Datchet, co. Bucks 14 May 1592 the son of Robert and Margery (Barker) Constable and grandson on the maternal side of Christopher Barker, printer to Queen Elizabeth I. His career as a bookseller and printer is summarized in "A Dictionary of the Booksellers and Printers who were at work in England from 1641 to 1667", by Henry R. Plomer:- "Francis Constable,bookseller in London and Westminster firstly at the (sign of) the White Lion, Paul's Churchyard, 1616-24; then in St Paul's Church Yard at the sign of the Crane, 1631; then under St Martin's Church in Ludgate, 1637; then at King Street, Westminster at the sign of the Goat, 1640; then at Westminster Hall,1640.He took up his freedom July 2nd 1614.His first registered publication was "Hymens Triumphes, entered on January 13th.1614/15.He published large

numbers of plays, in which he was associated for some years with Humphrey Moseley. It is probable that he rented a stall in Westminster Hall very much earlier than 1640 but that is the first appearance of the Hall in the imprint of any book."

Francis Constable died 1st. August 1647 of the plague and was buried the following day from St. Margaret, Westminster, while his widow was buried 4 August 1647. These registers are published and it should be noted that "Mr." is misread "Mrs." in his burial entry. Their only remaining son Robert was carried off by the plague the same month (buried 28 August) and it was after his death that the will of Alice Constable was filed for probate.

Notes for Thomas Constable:

Research Notes:

Thomas Constable is first heard of in 1534, when he was wounded in an affray at York assizes arising from the long-standing feud between his father and his uncle Sir William Percy. Two years later Sir Robert Constable's part in the Pilgrimage of Grace led to his attainder and execution. Like his elder brother Marmaduke, Constable came through unscathed but without his share in the forfeited patrimony, although in 1540 inquiries were made into his father's gift of a manor to him and his younger brother William and in 1546 their title to lands in Lincolnshire was again under review. By that time, however, his fortunes had probably been revived by his marriage to a Grimsby heiress: in August 1544 he was one of a 32-man consortium which paid £2,136 for monastic lands in Lincolnshire and Yorkshire. When in 1549 there was a threat of rebellion in Yorkshire, Constable manifested his loyalty by pursuing and capturing the ringleader.³ Constable was associated with Grimsby from at least 1545, when he was appointed an arbitrator to settle a local dispute in the mayor's court. It was doubtless his municipal standing which secured his election for the borough to two of Mary's Parliaments, but this was probably reinforced by his relationship with the 5th Earl of Westmorland, who married Constable's niece Jane in or after 1549. He was also related to the earls of Rutland, who had considerable Lincolnshire property, and in 1542 he had witnessed the will of the 1st Earl. As a Member of the Parliament of November 1554 Constable was one of those informed against in the King's bench in Easter term 1555 for withdrawing without leave before the dissolution. He failed to appear, even though he attended the next Parliament towards the close of that year, and was distrained 12 times, to a total amount of £2 0s.8d., before the case lapsed with the death of the Queen. He did not join the opposition to one of the government's bills in the Parliament of 1555.⁴

The final distraint of Michaelmas 1558 is the last reference which has been found to Constable, who may thus have died at about that time, perhaps of the epidemic disease then abroad.

129. **Agnes Wentworth**⁴⁶⁻⁴⁸, daughter of Roger Wentworth and Margery Le Despencer, was born in 1440 in Nettlested, Suffolk, England⁴⁷⁻⁴⁸. She died on 20 Apr 1496 in Flamborough, Yorkshire, England⁴⁷⁻⁴⁸.

Notes for Robert Sheriff of Yorkshire Constable:

Research Notes:

Sir Robert Constable involved in some of the events of the Wars of the Roses, including being at the Battle of Bosworth Field in 1485. Many of the later Constable family descend from him and from them many of the numerous people descended from Yorkshire Aristocracy. He is an ancestor of Timothy J. Owston, Queen Elizabeth II, Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother, HH The Aga Khan, (pdf) Diana Princess of Wales, The Duchess of York, The Duchess of Kent, Lord Habgood, a previous Archbishop of York and many others.

Although Sir Robert Constable is a Yorkshireman, he had inherited lands in Lincolnshire from his great-uncle Thomas Cumberworth who had died in 1451, so he can be described as being of Somersby, Lincolnshire and Flamborough, East Yorkshire. Sir Robert had also inherited land in Lubesthorpe, Leicester from his father who had inherited it from his Zouche ancestors. He was elected by the relatively few voters of the County of Lincolnshire as its MP in 1459 and later he was MP for Yorkshire in 1478.

Robert was born at Holme on Spalding Moor in the East Riding of Yorkshire on Easter day (4th April) 1423, the eldest son and heir of Sir Robert Constable of Flamborough and Holme on Spalding Moor (died 1441), by Agnes daughter of the Great Judge Sir William Gascoigne of Gawthorpe (died 1419) in Yorkshire, Chief Justice (see the excellent Alabaster memorial at Harewood Church) and his second wife Joan Pickering. The family had lived at Holme on Spalding Moor for generations, having inherited land there some time ago. He was under age at the date of his father's death and remained a minor for three years. This Robert married Agnes daughter of Sir Roger Wentworth of North Elmsall and Nettlestead in Suffolk M.P. and his wife Margery Despencer, heiress of Nettlestead, widow of John Baron de Ros (died at the Siege or Battle of Baugé on 22 March 1421), Agnes survived him and died in 1496. Sir Philip Wentworth, a brother of Agnes Wentworth was killed at the Battle of Hexham in 1464 and was grandfather of Margery Wentworth (died 1550), wife of Sir John Seymour of Wolfe Hall, the parents of Queen Jane Seymour, Edward Seymour Duke of Somerset and Lord Thomas Seymour, the last husband of Queen Catherine Parr (died 1548).

Sir Robert Constable, who died in 1441, owned part of Lubesthorpe Manor in Leicester which he had inherited as a descendant of one of the heiresses of the Zouche family of that place. This was inherited by Sir Robert Constable (1423-1488) who still owned it in 1470 when in June he removed his interest in the property with a Quitclaim. He was probably trying to consolidate his family land interests in Yorkshire and Lincolnshire. In the previous Century the family were connected to William la Zouche, Archbishop of York who is now thought to come from the Lubesthorpe Branch of the family (see the Oxford Dictionary of Biography article about the Archbishop). Further information about the Constable inheritance will be entered on the Zouche page after finding references to documents referred to in the RCHM Rutland volume (1905).

Constable can be found as an elector in Yorkshire in 1442, 1447, 1449 and in 1450. He was also an elector in the City of Lincoln City electorate in 1450. He was increased his profile by also being found on the Yorkshire Commissions from 1444, and the array in December 1459. During the Sir John Fastolf's life he was keeper of Sir John's lands in Suffolk from 1448-1453. He was appointed a Justice of the Piece in the East Riding of Yorkshire from 16 June 1453 till his death. Sir Robert was summoned to appear before the Great Council for Yorkshire in April 1455, due to his Lancastrian sympathies. But by the 6th October he had been pardoned as being 'of Flamburgh' esq". On the 6 Oct, 1455 he took part in Lancastrian commissions and this lasted until May 1460. As this point he must have changed to the Yorkists as he was knighted between 25 June 1460 and 10 May 1461 by the Yorkists, and henceforth took part on all their commissions. His brother-in-law Sir Philip Wentworth remained Lancastrian and was attainted and executed in 1464 (see above). Sir Robert was probably a Percy retainer and present at the Battle of Heworth (suburb on the Northern side of York) between the Baronial families of Nevilles and the Percy on 24 August 1453.

Sir Robert Constable was Sheriff of Yorkshire (see Ormrod), and according to one modern printed source Mayor of York**, 1461-2. His years as Sheriff in Yorkshire were 1478-9. He was also a Justice of the Peace for Lindsey 16 May 1461 to 7 Sep 1470; steward of all lands in Yorkshire. and Lincolnshire forfeited by the Earl of Northumberland and Lord Ros, in August 1461. About this time he had the grant of Hessle and Howden for life, though had to be pardoned 18 May 1462. He went to Scotland one of an embassy to Scotland in April 1464, and negotiating the truce with the Scots at Newcastle in October 1466. Sir Robert was the Sheriff of Lincolnshire in 1466 to 1467. he was further pardoned in 1468, February 1469 and on the 26th November 1471. The Readeption government put him on commissions and consequently Edward IV pardoned and employed him. Curiously and interestingly Robert was part-owner of a pirate ship in 1473 and thus ordered to pay compensation for its actions in attacking Scottish shipping. In December 1477 he was elected for Yorkshire in December in 1477, and on all Richard III's commissions. The King, Richard III, appointed Sir Robert Constable one of those to keep the border (with Scotland) in 1484; and pardoned him as of Flamborough, alias of Somerby, Lincolnshire. Sir Robert, a bit like a noble administrative 'Vicar of Bray' retained his place on the Bench through every revolution and was in the end pardoned by the Tudors, in 16 Jan 1485/6. He ended his life a lot wealthier than any other Constable for generations and he was able to finance his sons foundation of new branches of his family. Unfortunately that whilst some descendants did very well for themselves and their families many others were to end up on the execution block in the next century. After the family problems with the Tudors his descendant Sir William Constable, Baronet, the last of the Flamborough Constables must have reflected on the irony when he signed the execution warrant of King Charles I. He died well before the Restoration of 1660, though the Stuarts did try and posthumously dishonour him.

Sir Robert Constable (oddly for a fifteenth century person of any rank we have a birth and death date for him) died on the 23 May 1488; when Marmaduke, aged 31 and more, was his son and heir; lands in Yorkshire and Lincolnshire. Actually Marmaduke was probably about ten years older as he was a witness in a York Diocesan Court Case in 1503 aged 57 (DC.CP.1503/3). Sir Robert was head of a powerful family. Sons included - Sir Marmaduke***, John, Dean of Lincoln, Sir Robert and Sir William. His daughters married Sir Thomas Metham, Sir William Eure, Sir Gervase Clifton (1483), Sir William Tyrwhitt, Sir Ralph Bigod, Sir William Scargyll and Sir Ralph Ryther. I have discounted the Dorothy who married a knight called Sir Legard Cholmley as I am not convinced that either existed.

ISSUE OF SIR ROBERT CONSTABLE AND AGNES WENTWORTH

Sir Marmaduke Constable of Flamborough, MP known as 'Little Sir Marmaduke' John Constable, Priest, died 17 December 1485, Dean of Lincoln

Sir Robert Constable, of North Cliffe in Yorkshire, Sergeant at Law, died 1501, married and had issue.

Roger Constable

Sir William Constable of Caythorpe, married and had issue.

Elizabeth Constable, married Sir Thomas Metham, Knight, and had issue.

Margaret Constable, married Sir William Eure, Knight, and had issue.

Agnes Constable, married firstly Walter Griffith and had issue, and secondly Sir Gervase Clifton.

Anne Constable, married Sir William Tyrwhit of Kettleby in Lincolnshire, and had issue. Their daughter Agnes Tyrwhitt (died 1558) went on to marry in 1496 Thomas Baron Burgh (died 1549) and their son Sir Edward Burgh (died 1533) married Catherine Parr as her first husband.

Catherine Constable, married Sir Ralph Ryther of Ryther

Margery Constable, married Sir Ralph Bigod and had issue. Their descendants include the poor grandson Sir Francis Bygod 1507-1537 who was executed in 1537, a consequence of his involvement in the Pilgrimage of Grace.

* Mayor of York - No other record of this found, so I am prepared to discount this.

* Marmaduke was the 'Little Sir Marmaduke' who fought at Flodden (1513) with his sons. He captained the left wing of the army in the battle and received personal thanks from Henry VIII. He has many descendants. There is some evidence that many of his sons and nephews were also at Flodden. Sir Marmaduke the head of the family thus leading a family group to the Scottish Campaign, indeed his nephew Marmaduke Constable of Cliffe remembered local men who had gone to the Scottish wars in his Will. There is a memorial to 'Little Sir Marmaduke' in Flamborough Church and the ruins of their house can be seen in a field a few yards away. He was himself High Sheriff of York 1480-1, 1488-9 and 1509-10, and his biography appears in Ormrod above. His son Robert was to be a leader of the disastrous 'Pilgrimage of Grace' in 1536.

There is some evidence, in an article in the Oxford Dictionary of National Biography which refers to Joan Pickering Greystock Gascoigne's Will that her children were not by her Gascoigne husband and were from an earlier marriage. Indeed her Will is printed and an edited comment does make the simple point that her children do not have a surname given in the Will. But this is not referred to anywhere else as Sir Robert Constable is always listed as marrying Agnes the daughter of Sir William Gascoigne. Indeed, Sir Robert married Agnes Gascoigne and their eldest son was born in 1423, so they probably married at the latest in 1422.
