In this 90-minute feature, a grieving family of renowned classical musicians retreats to a secluded forest cabin after the death of their patriarch, Robert—a celebrated conductor with a mysterious past. Clara, the mother, struggles to hold the family together while battling her own buried guilt and unspoken feelings for Jay, Robert's former protégé. Elise, the eldest daughter, grows increasingly convinced that Clara and Jay conspired to kill her father, while Marie, the youngest, secretly explores her late father's occult notebook, hoping to bring him back.

The family's fragile dynamic is further disrupted by Lyra, an enigmatic nanny with a hidden agenda. As Lyra weaves her way into their lives, old wounds, and long-buried secrets rise to the surface.

When Murmur - a hungry creature neither entirely celestial nor demonic—emerges, it preys on their deepest desires and the lengths they're willing to go to fulfill them. Love, loss, and ambition collide as the family is forced to confront the truth about themselves and the haunting legacy Robert left behind. In the end, they must make impossible choices before the shadow of the past consumes them entirely.

Elise

At 11 years old, Elise is sharp, imaginative, and fiercely determined. Haunted by the belief that her father was murdered, she obsessively tries to understand his death. Her arc explores the devastating effects of unchecked grief and the realization that some losses cannot be reversed.



Marie

At just 8, Marie seems innocent and playful, but she hides a precocious mind and a penchant for keeping secrets. Her arc is about growing up—coming to understand the weight of her actions, the dangers of secrecy, and the fragile balance of trust within her family.

GIAR FIRS

Clara

A celebrated pianist, Clara carries the weight of her late husband's legacy and her own struggles with motherhood. Torn between her love for her daughters and her desire to escape into her career, she hides a deep guilt and simmering tension with Jay. Her arc challenges her to reconcile her responsibilities as a mother with her personal desires, ultimately facing the cost of past choices.

Jay

A talented yet insecure figure in the classical music world, Jay struggles with his identity under the shadow of Clara's late husband, who was both his mentor and best friend. Burdened by guilt and unspoken feelings for Clara, his arc is about finding his own voice while confronting his desire to take Robert's role in the family.




Robert

The late patriarch, Robert's presence looms over the family through his music, journal, and the ritualistic secrets he left behind. A tall, eerie creature that feels both ancient and otherworldly, Murmur isn't fully angelic or demonic but something in between. Its body is twisted, with sharp stumps where wings might have been, and its long limbs move with a strange, unnerving grace. Inspired by the kind of monsters seen in Guillermo del Toro's films, Murmur is terrifying yet oddly captivating. As Robert's rituals bring it closer to the family, it feeds on their grief and secrets, becoming a dangerous force they can't ignore.


It doesn't hurt. Just one step.

Composer: Theo Ammon


