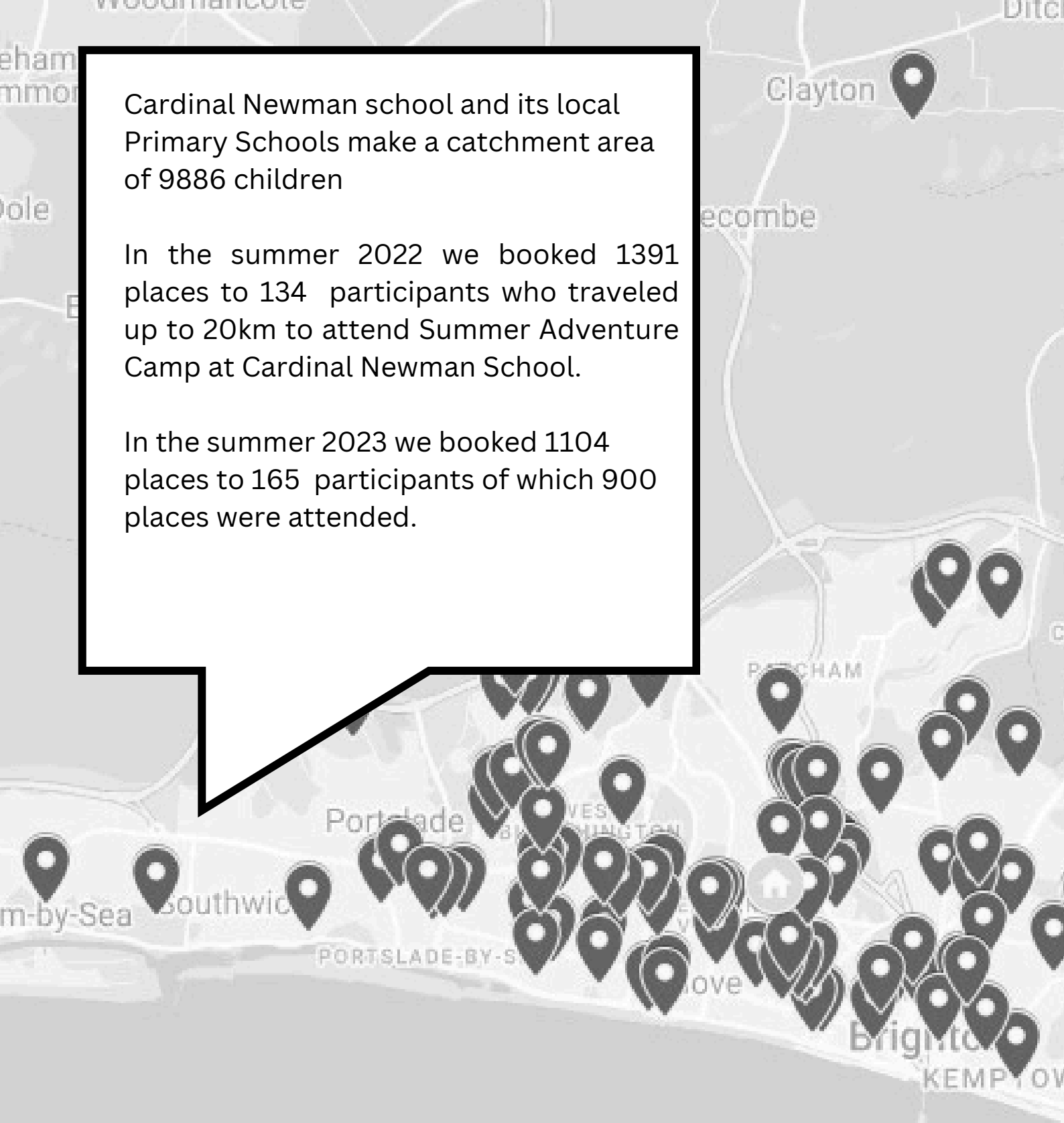

Cardinal Newman school and its local Primary Schools make a catchment area of 9886 children

In the summer 2022 we booked 1391 places to 134 participants who traveled up to 20km to attend Summer Adventure Camp at Cardinal Newman School.

In the summer 2023 we booked 1104 places to 165 participants of which 900 places were attended.


Within this catchment 19% of pupils are on Free School Meals (FSM)

Over 21% of pupils within this catchment have English as an additional language

The catchment area includes a number of wards (Including Brighton and Hove 027c) that are within the 20% most deprived in the UK

In 2023 19% of our participants in identified as having SEND

With an average of 36 participants per day this means that every day nearly 7 participants have an identified as having additional needs.



The Secondary and Primary Schools in East Grinstead make a catchment area of 6184 children

During the summer of 2022 we offered 960 places on our HAF club and 600 places in our paid provision.

Children, on average, booked for 2 weeks (10 days) giving approximately 156 unique participants



Within this catchment 1000 Pupils (16.17%) have special educational needs

This suggests that approximately 10 children each day had special educational needs.

Of these 6184 pupils 634 (10.25%) are deemed to be persistantly Absent.



2024

Delivering childcare to children aged 6-16 brings a huge amount of reward but also a number of challenges as we strive to deliver #Fun #Friendship #Adventure in both city and rural locations.

As we look forward to 2024 we have a number of questions we must ask;

- How do we work with our partners to develop our **capacity** and **capability** to offer places to participants with special educational needs and disabilities, especially those that need 1:1 support?
- How do we work with our partners to improve our **reach** to eligible participants? (we are currently reaching approximately 2.5% of eligible participants within our catchments)
- How do we work with out partners to improve the **attendance** rate of our participants. (approximately 81% this year)
