Older individuals

Understanding Their Feelings

- 1. Loss of Identity: For many, their role in the church is deeply tied to their sense of purpose and identity.
- 2. Generational Transition: They may feel replaced as younger leaders take on responsibilities or as the church adopts new practices.
- 3. Change in Community Dynamics: A shift in the church culture or relationships can leave them feeling disconnected.

Steps to Address the Issue

- 1. Acknowledge Their Contributions: Recognize the value of their years of service and express genuine appreciation for their dedication.
- 2. Encourage Mentorship: Invite them to mentor younger members, allowing their wisdom and experience to continue shaping the church.
- 3. Create New Opportunities: Offer roles that honor their abilities, such as prayer ministry, hospitality, or teaching.
- 4. Foster Inclusion: Involve them in discussions about church changes to ensure they feel heard and valued.

Encouraging Personal Growth

Think about this and pray about and for our Churches

John Mohler DOM The Bible offers wisdom, encouragement, and guidance specifically for older individuals, affirming their value, purpose, and role in God's plan. Here are key themes and scriptures that speak to older people:

- **1. Wisdom and Experience are Gifts: Job 12:12**: "Is not wisdom found among the aged? Does not long life bring understanding?"
 - The Bible emphasizes that with age comes wisdom, which is a valuable resource for guiding others and glorifying God.

Proverbs 16:31: "Gray hair is a crown of splendor; it is attained in the way of righteousness."

- Aging is seen as honorable, especially for those who live in righteousness.
- **2. Continued Purpose and Fruitfulness: Psalm 92:14**: "They will still bear fruit in old age, they will stay fresh and green."
 - God assures that older individuals can remain spiritually fruitful and vibrant, continuing to make a difference.

Titus 2:2-5: Paul instructs older men and women to be examples of godliness and to mentor younger generations.

- Older Men: "Be temperate, worthy of respect, self-controlled, and sound in faith, love, and endurance."
- Older Women: "Be reverent in the way they live... and teach what is good. Then they can urge the younger women to love their husbands and children."

- **3. Strength in God's Faithfulness: Isaiah 46:4**: "Even to your old age and gray hairs I am He, I am He who will sustain you. I have made you and I will carry you; I will sustain you and I will rescue you."
 - This verse is a reminder that God's care and purpose for individuals do not diminish with age.
- **2 Corinthians 4:16**: "Therefore we do not lose heart. Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day."
 - The focus is on spiritual renewal and eternal hope, regardless of physical aging.
- **4. Leaving a Legacy: Psalm 71:18**: "Even when I am old and gray, do not forsake me, my God, till I declare your power to the next generation, your mighty acts to all who are to come."
 - Older individuals are called to share their testimony of God's faithfulness with the younger generation.

Deuteronomy 32:7: "Remember the days of old; consider the generations long past. Ask your father and he will tell you, your elders, and they will explain to you."

- Elders have a vital role in preserving and sharing the history and teachings of faith.
- **5. Comfort and Assurance: Proverbs 3:5-6**: "Trust in the Lord with all your heart and lean not on your own understanding; in all your ways submit to Him, and He will make your paths straight."

 God encourages trust and dependence on Him in every season of life.

Lamentations 3:22-23: "Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for His compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness."

 This is a reminder of God's steadfast love and faithfulness, which sustain us throughout our lives.

Summary: The Bible reassures older individuals that they remain vital and purposeful in God's plan. It calls them to use their wisdom and experience to mentor others, bear spiritual fruit, and testify to God's faithfulness. They are encouraged to trust in God's sustaining power and to view aging as a time of renewed purpose and deeper reliance on Him.

I hope these words encourage you and I would pray that you would go back and look at them from time to time for strength and guidance. John Mohler
