In this session 3 scenarios were presented showing how opportunities to share our faith may occur in our everyday lives. First, Shopping in WalMart was presented by Elizabeth Mohler (Bethany IBC) and Sheri Joyce (Bethany FB), Second, Chance meeting In a coffee shop was presented by Sarah Williamson (Faith Bible Church) and Bobbie Johnson (Gilman City FB). The setting for the third scenario was a basketball game. This was presented by Debbie Bennett (Immanuel) and Mary Brant (Gilman FB). Next in the program was a game, created by Lori Puls and Becci Shew (both from New Hope Princeton) that included all the women in attendance.

- The director of missions supports, encourages and challenges pastors.

• Director of missions puts a "face" on the denomination for churches and on the churches for the denomination.

• The three- dimensional role of director of missions The role is to lead the association to fulfill its mission more faithfully, effectively and efficiently.

Greetings, brothers and sisters in Christ!

God continues to move here at First Baptist Church of Bethany, and I'm grateful for the opportunity to share a snapshot of His work with our Harrison Baptist family.

Over the past two months, we've been blessed with a vibrant and encouraging season of ministry. We launched a verse-by-verse sermon series through the Gospel of Matthew in early February, and God has been using His Word to draw our hearts to Christ, challenge our obedience, and remind us of our mission to make disciples. It's been refreshing to watch our church family respond with excitement for the Word.

On Wednesday nights, our Table Talk Bible study began a new series in 1 Peter titled *Holiness in a Hostile World*. We're wrestling with how to live set-apart lives in a culture that increasingly opposes biblical truth. The conversations have been honest, rich, and Spirit-led.

Our youth had a powerful time of discipleship during the D-NOW weekend retreat, hosted by FBC Trenton at the end of February. The theme, *Alive and Free*, stirred hearts and sparked conversations among our teens about what it really means to live a life transformed by faith.

We've also seen continued growth and investment in our women's ministry. The *You Are Loved* ladies' event in February brought women from our church and community together for encouragement, worship, and the security system (including new cameras and door-access

In March, several of our ladies attended the *Women of Worship Retreat* at Immanuel Baptist Church, where they were deeply encouraged through testimonies, music, and teaching focused on missions among refugees. The *Heritage of Hymns* Community Wide Easter choir launches its rehearsals this month. I hope it will unite voices from our church and the community as we prepare for a special Palm Sunday Cantata and community Good Friday service. Our choir director (my wife Julie!) has been joyfully teaching the history and theology behind the hymns, and we're already sensing God's blessing on the effort. Meanwhile, our weekly ministries continue strong:

- Kingdom Kids and Youth gather each Wednesday evening for food, games, worship, and biblical teaching.
- Ladies Bible Study meets on Tuesday mornings for fellowship and spiritual growth.
- Trail Life and American Heritage Girls have had great participation this semester, including a recent Trail Life campout.
- Our men's ministry met for breakfast in February and again in March, men spanning all generations from the church. Scott Neth lead the devotionals and it was a real encouragement to all who attended.God is also blessing our efforts in the area of facilities. Construction on both our Multipurpose Building and Children's Ministry Wing is moving steadily toward completion. Sheetrock, HVAC, and flooring are in place, new kitchen appliances are installed, and our upgraded
