## AN AMENDED ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE COLLECTION OF DISPOSAL OF BRUSH AND THE LIKE

BE IT REMEMBERED BY THE MAYOR AND BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE CITY OF NETTLETON, MISSISSIPPI:

SECTION 1: That this ordinance shall be known as the amended brush removal and disposal ordinance of the City of Nettleton which replaces the ordinance No. 135 passed and adopted on the 1<sup>st</sup> day of August, 2005.

SECTION 2: As used in this ordinance, the following terms shall have the following meaning:

(a) TREE – A tree is a woody plant having one erect stem at least 3 inches in diameter at a point 4 ½ feet above the ground.

(b) SHRUBS OR BUSHES – Shrubs or bushes are woody plants with several stems with no stem having a 3 inch diameter at a point 4 ½ feet above the ground.

SECTION 3: It shall be the duty and responsibility of all construction contractors, builders and remodelers, tree trimming contractors, tree surgeons, landscapers and the like to remove all brush and tree branches more than 4 inches in diameter resulting from their operation from the premises during the course of their respective operations and immediately following the same so as to leave the premises free and clear of such bushes, shrubs and tree limbs.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall take effect and be in force as provided by law.

This ordinance being the first reduced to writing as read and considered, first section by section, and then as a whole.

THEREUPON, upon motion duly made by Alderman Kirk Lindsey, seconded by Alderman Charles Morris, with Doug Brown recusing, to adopt the foregoing ordinance, section by section, and then as a whole, and the question being put to a roll call vote, the result was as follows:

Alderman Kirk Lindsey voted Yea

Alderman Charles Morris voted Yea

Alderman Willie Brandon, Jr. voted Yea

Alderman Larry Guess voted Yea
