### What to expect

- Depending on the amount of students present they may be split into groups for the tour
- Before the tour starts we go through safety procedures and risks with all the kids and ask questions about what they think the dangers are on the farm
- Kids will then get up close and personal with our cows, chickens and pigs during feeding and egg collection time.
- After the tour there will be time for morning tea (from their lunchboxes or supplied depending on package)
- Before going back on the bus the kids will all get a care package to take home with them to remember us by

### Cost

Our school tours are \$15 per student without morning tea, or \$25 per student including morning tea. We really value our educators and supervisors/parents and because of this they are welcome to attend free of charge.


### What to wear
