## Catechism Review: Salvation

**Salvation:** is the most significant part of our ministry. The separation of our Savior among other gods is His resurrection. We are saved by His grace. His sacrifice gave us life.

### Scriptural Basis:

- John 3:16
  - For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

# Discipline

## Catechism Review: Scriptures

**Discipline:** to train in self-control or obedience

- Restrained ability...Doing what's necessary in the moment although I can do more.
- 1 Cor 10:23 - All things are lawful for me, but all things are not expedient: all things are lawful for me, but all things edify not.(KJV) "I have the right to do anything," you say—but not everything is beneficial. "I have the right to do anything"—but not everything is constructive. (NIV)

**Scriptural Basis:**

- **Required Discipline with Power:**
  - **Matthew 27:** 40 And saying, Thou that destroyest the temple, and buildest it in three days, save thyself. If thou be the Son of God, come down from the cross. 41 Likewise also the chief priests mocking him, with the scribes and elders, said, 42 He saved others; himself he cannot save. If he be the King of Israel, let him now come down from the cross, and we will believe him.43 He trusted in God; let him deliver him now, if he will have him: for he said, I am the Son of God.
- **Results of the Lack of Discipline**
  - Numbers 20:8-11
  - Deuteronomy 3:23-28
- **Required in Anger and Frustration**
  - Deuteronomy 3:23-28

**Ministry Discipline:**

- Interaction with People
  - 1 Corinthians 13 If I speak in the tongues[a] of men or of angels, but do not have love, I am only a resounding gong or a clanging cymbal. 2 If I have the gift of prophecy and can fathom all mysteries and all knowledge, and if I have a faith that can move mountains, but do not have love, I am nothing. 3 If I give all I possess to the poor and give over my body to hardship that I may boast,[b] but do not have love, I gain nothing.
  - Proverbs 25:9 - Debate thy cause with thy neighbor himself; and discover not a secret to another:
  - James 5:16 - Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.
  - 1 Timothy 6:20 Timothy, guard what has been entrusted to your care. Turn away from godless chatter and the opposing ideas of what is falsely called knowledge
