The Woodbury American Legion Post 501 is seeking candidates from local Woodbury High Schools for the 75th Annual American Legion Boys State that will be held June 8-14, 2025. Boys State will be held on the campus of St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota. All applications must be submitted by March 1 2025 to the Woodbury American Legion Post 501 at woodburypost501@gmail.com.

Applicants for Boys State must be juniors in High School, be in the upper class scholastically at their school and reside in Woodbury. Information has been provided to all Woodbury High Schools guidance counselors or principals, including East Ridge, Woodbury, New Life Academy, and the Woodbury Math and Science Academy. Applicants who reside in Woodbury but go to high school outside the city are also eligible to apply through Post 501.

Legion Boys State is a practical learning experience in local and state government. The week will emphasize civic leadership and pride in American citizenship, a detailed study of our government, and our country's democratic ideals. Highlights of the week include political speakers, mock trials, campaigning, elections, and announcement of Boys State Governor and State Constitution Officers.

Here are some of the pictures from the night's festivities.




**This Month in History – American Legion Birthday – 15 March 2025**

On this day 106 years ago, members of the American Expeditionary Force convened in Paris for the first American Legion caucus. Much as the birthday of the United States is celebrated on July 4, for the date in 1776 when patriots declared the independence of the British colonies and the spirit of America was born. March 15 is the date when The American Legion came to life.

Throughout the organization's history, local posts across the country have celebrated with festivities that have included the entire community. For the 20th birthday in 1939, Battle Mountain Post 71 in Hot Springs, S.D., brought out a 40-pound birthday cake - two pounds for every year of The American Legion's history. For the 38th birthday in 1957, Post 214 in Upper Darby, Pa., hosted an entire week's worth of events as part of American Legion Birthday Week, so proclaimed by the township's Board of Commissioners. Parties, dances and a two-act play were held at Post 214's clubhouse.
