After time in rehabilitation to learn Braille and how to function in the "normal" world, he went to law school and graduated with honors in 1975. He was then hired by the Federal Communications Commission in Washington DC and served 45 years helping to set policies and regulations for the telecommunication industry. He was such an inspiration to everyone he met but never felt he was any different than anyone else. He was not bitter about his experience - he

would always say "I was lucky enough to be born in a free country. The price that I paid was so that my family could live in a free country." When people would say that he gave so much more than they did, he would say "everyone who stood up to do whatever was asked of them, whether drafted or enlisted, whether in the guard, reserves, or full-time service, were all equal in their service to our country". Amen to that. As your Commander, I would be happy to visit with anyone who wants to share personal experiences during their military career. I encourage all my 3rd District Vice Commanders to visit their Posts. We need to count our blessings as we enjoy our holidays with family members and friends, and give special thanks to those who can't attend or be with us this season.

Dues Increase

Hopefully you have heard about the \$5.00 National dues increase coming next membership year. The Department finance committee is also recommending a \$3.00 dues increase next membership year. This will be voted on in July 2024. Where do your dues go when you pay your membership? Right now, National receives \$18.50, Department receives \$13.50 and the Hospital Association receives \$.25. Currently Third District Dues are \$3.00. Next membership year National will receive \$23.50, Department \$16.50, the Hospital Association will remain the same.

IMPORTANT

If your post needs to adjust their dues to reflect these increases, you will need to notify the Department Office by April. A form is sent to all posts (Post Data Form) in March and it is due back to Department by mid April. If you fail to send the form in, your dues will stay the same as the current year, BUT you will still be required to send in \$43.25 per member.

In my early years, I expected to live a long life. The military changed all that. Men and women die in their teens in war. Now I no longer expect to live a long life. Learning about the generations before us exposes that we live longer in years than ever before (If you are Jewish or Christian you know before the flood people could have lived 100's of years). Now saving up for retirement and the good years is not expected. Wanting to live longer remains an ideal though even if it comes with aches and pains.

Scanning the major world religions: Christianity, Muslim, Buddhism/Hinduism and Judaism results a focus on type of life lived, not necessarily how long lived. Old age is not a reward for a sinless or pure life. The reward is the type of afterlife.
