#### Surprised by Joy

Greetings Thundering Third Legion Family! The month of January is wrapping up and we soon will move into the shortest month of the year that can only mean that Spring isn't far behind.

As I was pondering what message I would share with you what kept coming back to me were 1) a question for y'all and 2) What time is it?

How is it going for you – in body, mind and spirit? What have you so far resolved to take on/do/fix/connect with? Last month I invited you to look around and to look deeply – who do you see? Who don't you see? But this month it's about looking within. Who am I? Do I like what I see? Is there another version of myself that I'd like to be?
