**Boys State 2026**

The Woodbury American Legion Post 501 is looking for candidates from local Woodbury high schools for the 75th Annual American Legion Boys State, taking place June 14–20, 2026, at St. John's University in Collegeville, Minnesota.

Boys State offers a hands-on learning experience in local and state government, where participants use their school knowledge and guidance from instructors to create and run their own city, county, and state governments. The week focuses on civic leadership, pride in citizenship, understanding our government, and democratic ideals, with activities like political speakers, mock trials, campaigning, elections, and announcing the Boys State Governor and State Constitution Officers.



Applicants must be high school juniors, rank in the upper part of their class, and live in Woodbury, though Woodbury residents attending school elsewhere may also apply through Post 501. Interested junior boys should contact their school guidance counselors, with applications due to Post 501 by April 1, 2026. Selected candidates will be notified by May 1, 2026.

DID YOU KNOW

Charles Schulz, the creator of the Peanuts comic strip, served in the United States Army during World War II from 1943 to 1946. He was a decorated combat veteran who reached the rank of Staff Sergeant and served as a light machine gun squad leader in the 20th Armored Division in Europe.

Mr. Schulz was drafted in early 1943, shortly after his mother passed away from cancer. He completed basic training at Camp Campbell, Kentucky, where he was assigned to the 8th Armored Infantry Battalion, 20th Armored Division. He was shipped to Europe in February 1945, arriving in Le Havre, France, just before the end of the war. His unit trekked 1,400 miles through France, Belgium, and Germany, and participated in the liberation of the Dachau concentration camp.



As a machine gun squad leader, Schulz saw action in the final months of the war. He was awarded the Combat Infantryman Badge (CIB) for actively fighting under fire, a distinction he considered his proudest possession. He later recalled a moment where he had a chance to fire his machine gun at German soldiers but realized he had forgotten to load it; the soldiers surrendered anyway. Charles Schulz was honorably discharged in January 1946.

Mr. Schulz frequently stated that his time in the army taught him "all I needed to know about loneliness". He channeled these experiences into the character of Charlie Brown. His wartime experience influenced the creation of Snoopy's persona as the "World War I Flying Ace," which allowed him to explore the themes of war and combat.

Throughout his life, Charles Schulz honored his military service and fellow veterans, specifically with D-Day and Veterans Day-themed strips, and he donated \$1 million to the construction of the National D-Day Memorial in Virginia.
