MN Department Fall Conference

This year's Fall Conference was held at the St Cloud Convention City on 27 Oct 2023.Your Commander (Bob Dolan), Vice Commander (JoAnne Kramer), and Seargent at Arms (Tim Crear) attended this year's sessions. The focus of the Fall Conferences is training and educating Posts on the various aspects of the Legion programs, Post processes & procedures, and Communications. Some of my take aways from the conference were:

- **2024 Membership dues increase:** National will be raising their portion of the dues to \$5 along with the MN Department and Third District with a \$3 and \$1 increase respectively. This will cause Posts to reevaluate the dues they charge members starting in July 2024. Post 501 will be reviewing and discussing this at the November Post meeting.
- **Try Something New Each Year:** One of the new events that Post 501 has been discussing is holding a blood drive. Blood donations is one of the many programs that the American Legion is passionate about. Look in future newsletter when details are finalized.
- The American Legion is Apolitical: 2024 will be a Presidential election year and we were reminded that as a non-profit we cannot overtly endorse a candidate running for political office. We all have an opinion about candidates, but when we are representing the American Legion, we need to be careful about our words and appearances.
- **Posts are a Bottom Up Organization:** It is you the members that run the Posts and not the Commander. This can only happen by participating in Post activities and meetings to make your voices heard. This is an extremely important concept and the cornerstone of how the Legion operates.
- Know your Veteran Service Office (VSO): The VSO is here to service the veterans in their community. They do this by counseling veterans on their benefits, assisting in the filing of Federal benefits, and networking with the various local, state, & Federal organizations to connect veterans to the appropriate services needed.

This Month in History - Veterans Day: 11 November 2023

Veterans Day is a time for us to pay our respects to those who have served. For one day, we stand united in respect for you, our veterans. This holiday started as a day to reflect upon the heroism of those who died in our country's service and was originally called Armistice Day. It fell on Nov. 11 because that is the anniversary of the signing of the Armistice that ended World War I. However, in 1954, the holiday was changed to "Veterans Day" in order to account for all veterans in all wars. We celebrate and honor America's veterans for their patriotism, love of country and willingness to serve and sacrifice for the common good.

When first celebrated as Armistice Day, the day marked the end of World War I, formally recognized on the "11th hour, of the 11th day, of the 11th month" in 1918.

Today we continue to celebrate the day as Veterans Day, still recognizing the original tie with November 11. That means Veterans Day is on the same day every year – November 11 – regardless of on which day of the week it falls.
