My feet went towards the sound of the guitar. After the long day of moving out to the site, setting up camp for a week of military training, I thought the music would be relaxing. I located a circle of young soldiers, about 10, sitting on equipment, engaged in remembering what they had just lived and survived through. They had returned from Iraq less than a year ago after fighting a war for 18 months. The guitar player would strum a bit and stop when someone said, "what song is this....?" Or "remember when...". They laughed, sat in silence and shook their heads in disbelief.

The atmosphere was holy they created. None of the songs were worship songs but nonetheless a transformative portal where the chaff was being separated from the wheat in their souls. Music has that power. It connects the left analytical to the right's imaginative feeling side in the same linear time space. It also can bring people together for a shared experience. We all dream the same dreams of peace, of love, of purpose here on earth.

Willie Nelson is an icon storyteller of music. He wrote his first song "The Storm has just begun", about a breakup with a girlfriend when he was just 12 (yes, 12 years old). He has been a part of making country music for 69 years. Those young soldiers probably sang a song or two of Willie Nelson's. There isn't anything on this earth that is beyond God's ability to use. Greetings Thundering Third, CAN DO!!!

As of June 30, the Third District is at 99.46% and we are in 1st place in Department Membership and 3rd in the 2024 Premier Race. We are..52% Point ahead of the 6th district. Keep the memberships flowing into Department and Mylegion, **Can Do**. So far, we have had 164 HQ transfers, putting us in 1st place. You should do follow-up buddy checks on all members during this time. Continue to bring in new members. So far, the district has added 285 brand-new members, and we are in 2nd place. We have 32 posts in the district at goal and 15 posts over 95% unfortunately we have 5 posts under 90%. We are coming up to the Department convention, and hope to see you there. To participate, you need to renew your membership online at Legion.org/renew. You will need your membership ID# and credit or debit card.
