Dues Increase

Hopefully you have heard about the \$5.00 National dues increase coming next membership year. The Department finance committee is also recommending a \$3.00 dues increase next membership year. This will be voted on in July 2024. Where do your dues go when you pay your membership? Right now, National receives \$18.50, Department receives \$13.50 and the Hospital Association receives \$.25. Currently Third District Dues are \$3.00. Next membership year National will receive \$23.50, Department \$16.50, the Hospital Association will remain the same.

IMPORTANT

If your post needs to adjust their dues to reflect these increases, you will need to notify the Department Officer by April. A form is sent to all posts (Post Data Form) in March and it is due back to Department by mid April. If you fail to send the form in, your dues will stay the same as this year, BUT you will still be required to send in \$43.25 per member.

The Chaplains Corner

Grief is a whole-body experience - mind, body and spirit by affecting our sleep; ability to concentrate; thoughts; emotions; and questions our belief about this world and the next. We grieve individually and collectively. I would like you to know that Swiss-American Psychiatrist Elizabeth Kubler-Ross (1926-2004), created the grief model - *Five Stages of Grief.* Many people gauge how they are doing after the death of their loved one using this model. Many have proven that it is more fluid than linear.

Grief is not neatly packed into first denial, second anger, third bargaining, fourth depression and lastly acceptance. Sometimes they come all within five minutes, sometimes not all are experienced and sometimes one or two lingers. Some grieve emotionally; some psychologically, all spiritually. Questions of what is the purpose of life(?) and where do we go, if anywhere, after death (?) are near when we are experiencing a death.

How deep and affecting our grief results from type and age of the one who died. We have less friction accepting someone who has lived a 'normal' life span than someone whose life ends in their early stages of life. For me and maybe for you too, a suicidal death is more difficult to come to terms with. My grief is intensified for a longer time. We humans have to make sense of the type of death. For so many that died by suicide it seems to be such a quick decision that ends a possibly long life. Suicides are not easy to make sense of. Sometimes they are the result of many complex strains that defy logic. All Life is precious and valuable, if it was not, suicides would not affect us, and we would not grieve.

I bring all of this up because November is a busy, holy, harvest month. Many of us will be gathering with family and friends. It is these together times when our listening heart can be opened to give (or receive) an extra hug, give or receive a telephone call from a fellow Legionnaire, or invite or go to a holiday occasion to be with others on these many days where we observe sacred and cultural days. For those who have a bountiful harvest, share with others who are drained in their grief. I love the song, *Lean on Me* for I find it fits so many occasions.

So remember, we are an organization that recognizes God's goodness as innate in all of us and our Constitution's First Amendment that "Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion, or prohibiting the free exercise thereof..." Here are the following religious holy days in November: Christians observe All Saint's Day and All Soul's Day; Hindu's celebrate Diwali; Baha'i' observe the birth of Ba'b and Ba'ha'u'allah. Also, November is Native American Heritage Month which has evolved from then President Reagan's, November 23-30 "American Indian Week. Remember, the answers are less important than the presence. May God hold us all dear. –

Thanks for all your efforts in getting us past the November 15th Target of 65%, as of October 18th, Third District is at 67.35%. The next goal is 75% by December 13th and we are well on our way to achieving this before then.
