SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE

“For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted.” (Gospel for Aug. 31, Lk 14:11)

One lesson of this parable in Luke’s Gospel is that when you exalt yourself, there’s nowhere to go but down. In the life of a disciple of Christ, we are called to develop the virtue of humility. We are called to self-giving service to others, not self-serving advancement of ourselves. Let us strive not to seek

worldly honors in an egotistical spirit, but rather to live as servants to others so that God may exalt us to eternal life.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, in which we celebrate the feast of Blessed Michael McGivney on Aug. 13, I challenge you to pray each day the Litany of Blessed Michael McGivney or the prayer for his canonization — and take time to reflect on his humility in serving the people of God.

Questions for Reflection:

Do you sometimes struggle with the sin of pride? How can you be at once humble of heart and yet bold in living and proclaiming your faith? What living examples of humble service have you found in your own life?

- **CIS Resources:**

- Booklets and Devotionals (includes 97 items). Most may be downloaded for free.
- CIS Store. Includes a wide ranging collection of catechetical and devotional resources, including prayer cards.
- Supreme Chaplain's Monthly Challenge: Each month, Archbishop William Lori – Supreme Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus – selects a brief passage from the Gospel reading of one of the Sunday Masses of the month. Archbishop Lori shares a brief reflection on the passage and issues a challenge for men to live for the month.

- **CIS Courses:**

- The Luke E. Hart Course. (Online): Based on the Catechism of the Catholic Church, this series answers three questions of deepest importance to any practicing Catholic or person looking for a better understanding of our faith: *What does a Catholic believe?*, *How does the Catholic worship?*, and *How does the Catholic live?*
- Faith Formation Online Course. (Online): As a search for truth (Veritas), this course addresses a number of topics about the Church, as well as issues facing Catholics around the world today, including guides to prayer, Catholic insights on dating, thoughts on the saints and much more.
- Catholic Correspondance Course: This course is made up of ten booklets which provide a series of readings on the basic beliefs of Catholics. Each lesson comes accompanied by a Lesson Summary and a Questionnaire booklet and test sheet, which is based on the material in the corresponding lesson.
