#### **GRAND KNIGHT'S MESSAGE**

"Nones"

As a mother and father sit watching TV their daughter comes into the room and states, "Mom, Dad, I think I'm going to become a "None." They absent mindedly say while continuing to watch TV, "That's nice that you are discovering a vocation."

The fastest growing "religious" group in the United States are the "Nones." They define their religious affiliation as "none" or "nothing in particular." The following are common characteristics among the "Nones":

- "Nones" comprise one-third of adults under 30.
- Nearly 75% were raised in a religious home (often leaving the faith in their teens).
- They tend to be young males.
- Although they can be found anywhere in the country, a disproportionate number reside in the Pacific Northwest.

We as men of the Knights of Columbus have a significant impact on whether or not our children continue in the Faith as adults. Studies have revealed the following:

- If both the **mother and father are deeply involved in the Faith**, approximately <u>35%</u> of their children will maintain their Faith as adults.
- If the **mother is deeply involved in the Faith**, but the father is not, **only** <u>5%</u> of their children will continue in their Faith as adults.
- If the mother is not deeply involved in the Faith, but the **father is deeply involved**, approximately <u>35%</u> of their children will continue in their Faith as adults.

The common variable is the father's involvement in his Faith. As Catholic gentlemen we must do more than go to Mass on Sunday and say grace before meals. Our children must observe that we are "knowledgeable" in and deeply "committed" to our Faith. They must see how our Catholic Faith impacts all aspects of our lives.

#### SUPREME CHAPLIN'S MONTHLY CHALLENGE - JANUARY 2021

"They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. Then they opened their treasures and offered him gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh." (Gospel for Jan. 3, Mt 2:10-11)

It's quite a magnificent scene: Intellectuals from a faraway land, not even of the Jewish faith, travel to pay homage to the newborn king. Their gifts acknowledge the child's kingship and foreshadow the sacrifice he was to make. They are also a sign of what a gift this newborn king is to the entire world. We must also recognize every child as a gift to the world, created in the image of God himself. May we recommit ourselves with renewed vigor to protect and cherish the life and dignity of every human person.

#### Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

I challenge you to take a concrete, tangible action to support the cause for life in your community, by donating money or supplies to a pregnancy resource center, praying outside an abortion facility or joining your parish's pro-life group. Second, I challenge you to participate with your brother Knights in the Faith in Action Novena for Life program or, if possible, the March for Life program.

#### **Questions for Reflection:**

Do you see the image of God in every child, in every person, or do you sometimes look at others as objects to be used? What does taking action to defend life show you about how individuals can impact the world? What more can you do to support the cause for life, whether the contribution is great or small or consists of prayer or works?
