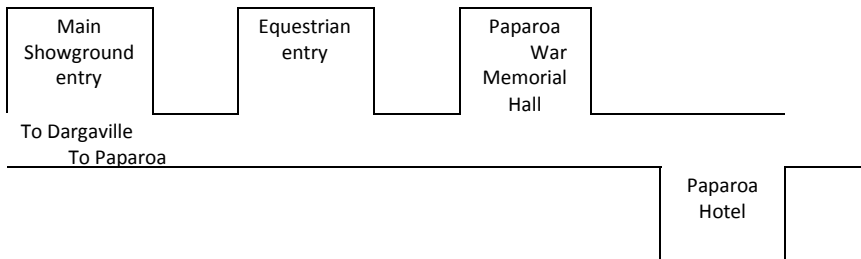

CATTLE SECTION

VENUE

Cattle entries come through the Main Showground entry gate. Once inside you simply follow directions. Parking is beside the Cattle pavilion.



GATE ENTRY Adults: \$10

Children: \$5 per child for the first two children with all under 5 year olds free

Free Gate Entry if you are a Member of the North Kaipara Agricultural Association (NCAA) and /or are the holder of a District Show Pass.

Notice Regarding Covid 19

Please be advised that the running of the Paparoa A & P Show is dependent on the status of Covid 19 restrictions at the time. If we are in level 3 the show will be cancelled. If we are in level 2 restrictions, the intention is that the show will continue, but with social distancing rules in place in line with the [covid19.govt.nz](https://www.covid19.govt.nz) website requirements.

All Exhibitors agree to comply with the terms of the Health and Safety Act 2015 and its subsequent amendments. The North Kaipara Agricultural Association will not accept responsibility in any claim from any person resulting from non-compliance with the Health and Safety Act.

Livestock Exhibitors must follow the instructions of Stewards and Officials. Exhibitors are responsible for ensuring animals are kept under control at all times. The North Kaipara Agricultural Association reserves the right to order immediate removal from the Showgrounds of any animal it considers dangerous, unruly or unmanageable.

LATE ENTRIES

Late entries will not be accepted for Breed classes on the day. Please note that calves entered for this section must be born on or after June 1st 2020

Young Handlers' entries will close at 11 am to allow classes to begin at 11.15 am. Ages of exhibitors as at 1st October 2020

PARKING (for competitors only) – After unloading your animals, please park your trucks, floats, trailers, etc, in the area behind the Cattle Pavilion. Keep the ramp free for others to use.

NO DOGS ALLOWED

Unauthorised dogs are not allowed anywhere on the Showgrounds. They will be required to be removed immediately from the grounds and any competitor with an unauthorised dog will be disqualified. Dogs allowed by legislation e.g. guide dogs or police dogs and competition dogs are permitted on the Showgrounds.

SMOKE FREE SHOW

Smoking is prohibited everywhere on the Show Grounds.

GENERAL INFORMATION

- Unregistered animals may be entered into breed classes but they must be of a specific breed – no crossbreeds will be permitted.
- Rosettes, ribbons and any prize money will be to third place only. Cups, trophies and beef section prizes will be presented at the conclusion of the All Beef Breeds classes in the afternoon. Although Cups and Trophies cannot be taken home there will be opportunity for winners to have their photograph taken with them. Photographs may be used in publicity opportunities.

Cups and Trophies will be displayed in a cabinet in the Sports Pavilion after being engraved with the winner's details.

- A Novice Class will replace the Junior Cattle Classes but will still be for yearling heifers or steers – **no bulls allowed**. It will now be judged as in a Breed class.

INFORMATION REGARDING LIVESTOCK CLASSES

GENERAL SAFETY

Young children/babies **are not** allowed in the cattle section i.e. stalls, wash down areas, loading ramp, etc. There are loading facilities near the cattle pavilion.

No abuse of animals tolerated at any time.

All bulls 15 months and over to have a nose ring and two leads plus be well secured in stalls.

Nose clips and extra leads advised for any other animal which may be nervous/troublesome on the day.

Anyone involved with the show cattle is advised to wear Protective footwear.

Animals' birth dates to be shown. For all animals two years or older a current TB clearance form is required. All cattle must have official identification tags including NAIT.

CATTLE CLASSES

There are five class sections

The list of which section that breeds can enter is set out below:

- 1 All Breeds (AB) – open to all full blood / purebred beef
- 2 Calf Club (CC) – Junior and Senior – see below
- 3 Novice Class (NC) – Youth exhibitors – see ages below
- 4 RAS Young Handlers (NDC) – Junior and Senior – see ages below
- 5 Dry Dairy (DD)

Entry fee for the beef / dairy breed classes is \$6.00 per animal per class.

Prize money for cattle classes is \$20 (1st), \$15 (2nd), \$10 (3rd).

Calf Club Classes

No entry fee and no money for prizes. Rosettes to 3rd place. Classes start at 9.00 am

Ages for competitors are:

Junior 11 years and under **Senior** 12 years and over. The Judges are experienced in Calf Club requirements and their decision is final.

Obstacle Course

No entry fee - sponsored prizes - Classes start at 9.45am

Novice Cattle Section Entry fee \$3.00.

Sponsored prizes

Rosettes to 3rd place.

Classes start at 10.30 am.

Ages for competitors are: **Section One** 12 years and under **Section Two** 13 to 18 years. This is specifically for animals which are **yearlings** which may or may not have been shown as calves the previous season.

CATTLE CLASSES CONTINUED

Malcolm Hutchings NDC RAS Young Handlers Classes

No entry fee. Classes start at 11.15 am with cut off time for entries at 11.00 am. Rosettes to 3rd place. Prize Money \$20 (1st), \$10 (2nd) \$5 (3rd).

See Conditions for Entry attached. Ages for competitors are: **Junior** 12 years and under **Senior** 13 to 18 years. Ages as from October 1st 2020.

Competitors may enter a dairy animal or a beef animal but not both. The dairy handlers and beef handlers classes will be separate.

Judging will consider the areas set out in the eligible A & P Schedules. The Judges for this section are qualified with the RAS and their decision is final.

Conditions below for entry into Young Handlers Classes

- The competition is open to all young beef and dairy handlers and includes all Northern District A & P Shows from Kaitaia and Districts to Franklin including the Easter Show at Auckland where the overall finalists will be selected.
- Open to all young handlers within New Zealand.
- Competitors may use an animal of any age and the animal does not have to be the property of the handler
- Each competitor may only enter either the beef or the dairy class, not both. To be eligible for the Northern District prize the competitor must have competed at four or more Northern District Shows in these classes this show season.
- The competitor may enter as many shows as they wish but their points will only be taken from their four highest shows.
- The first four placings of the overall competition (one dairy and one beef handler) will each receive \$100 for 1st, \$75 for 2nd, \$50 for 3rd and \$25 for 4th sponsored by the NDCRAS and a medal awarded by the RAS of New

Zealand. In the event of a tie the prize money will be split.

Ability of Handling Animal

- To parade and “show off” animal
- To stop when asked
- Able to “stand” animal up
- To move on again as requested

• If entries are low competitors may be paraded together, however, each class will be judged separately. If there are insufficient entries then the age groups will be combined to make one class

- Points will be scaled according to how many entries are in the class at each show.

Judging will consider the following areas

Turnout – Appearance of Handler

- The dress, footwear and general tidiness will be considered i.e. clean, strong shoes or boots. No jandals or gumboots.
- If a hat is worn it must be worn correctly.
- No logos or advertising to be present on any clothing including hats.
- For the Easter Show the 13-18 age group would be wearing a breed uniform or a white coat.

Presentation of Animal

- The animal itself is not to be judged, however, the general presentation is to be taken into consideration as the handler will have prepared the animal for the ring.
- The halter should be clean and fit the animal correctly. Rope or leather halters allowed.
- For beef competitors, if a show stick is used it must be carried correctly.

Be aware of different leading styles i.e. dairy may lead from the front and beef lead at the shoulder. The judge may request that the competitor swap animals with another competitor.

Knowledge of Animal

- Breeding – know the breed and able to name sire and dam
- Age – date and birth of animal.
