Ham en Kaas Souttert A South African Tart using your Christmas Leftovers Spittert is "Savory Tart" submitted by Nena

INGREDIENCE:

1 T. Olive Oil
1 T. Butter
2 Onions, finely chopped
1 lb. raw bacon, chopped into bite-sized pieces
1 oz. chives, finely chopped
1 cup grated cheddar cheese
4 large eggs, whisked
2/3 pint of milk
3 oz. flour, sieved



INSTRUCTIONS:

Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fry onions in the butter and oil in a large frying pan until softened Add bacon pieces to the onions and fry on a high heat to brown the meat and get it fully cooked. Be careful not to burn Remove from the heat and place in a large mixing bowl to cool down Stir in the grated cheese and chives In another bowl, prepare the batter by mixing the eggs, milk and flour Grease a pie dish - measuring 12" - with butter Spoon the bacon mixture in the pie dish and spread the contents evenly Pour the batter in and even out the filling Bake in the oven for 25 minutes or until the top is golden and the center is cooked

Serve with a salad with acidic dressing to cut through the richness
