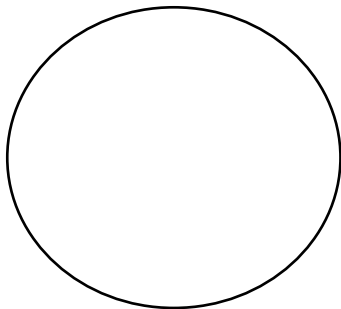

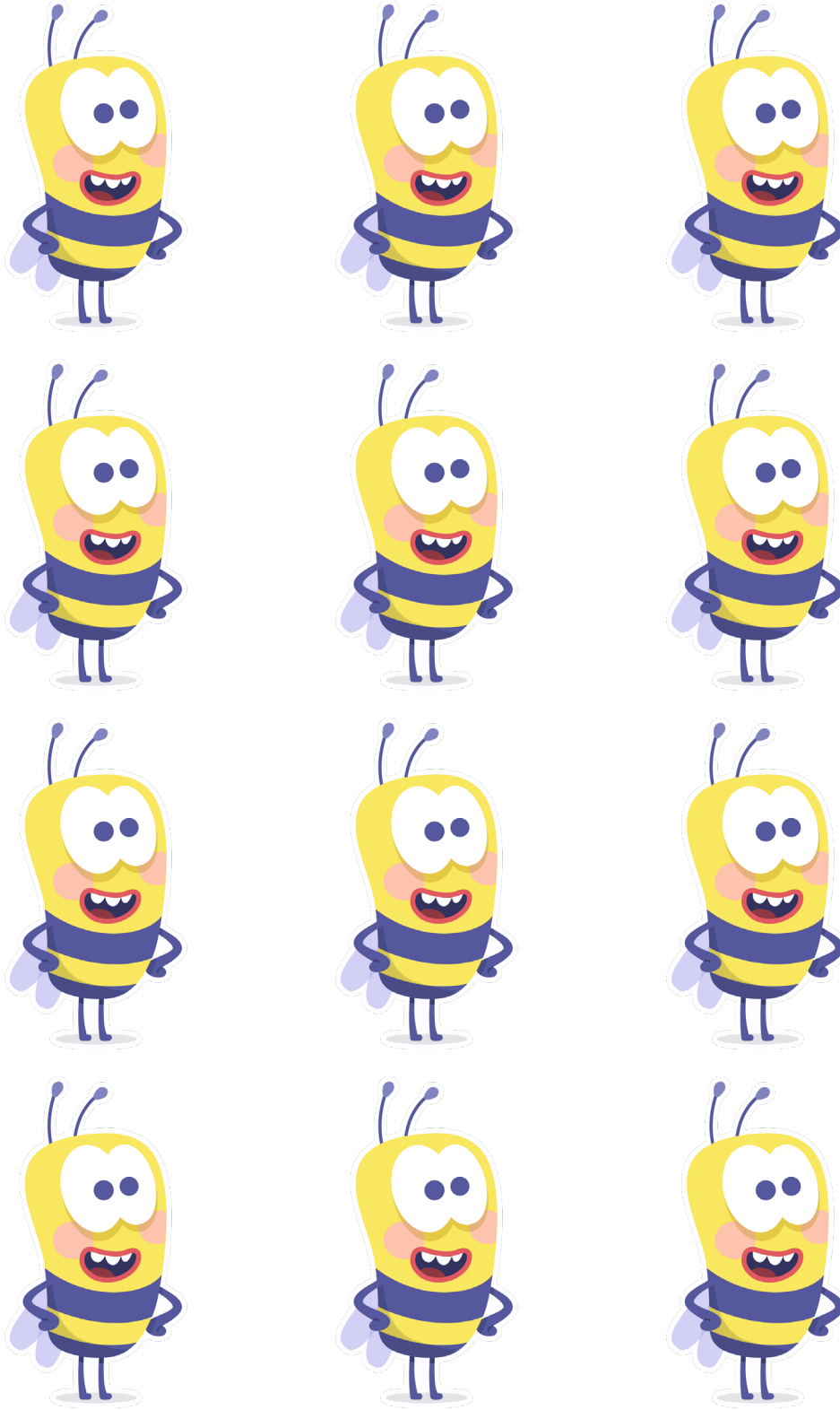

Crowds Roll Into Newton For Car Show



NEWTON—Mike Stanhope painted his 1968 Camaro he had on display Saturday during the Newton Car Show with spray paint or what he called a Rustoleum rattle can. The color is Starburst Yellow. It's a vehicle he's had for the last 44 years and is the first car he ever had. The Benton resident said he got the vehicle at age 17, and his two brothers both had 1969 Camaros, which both were orange. He said he grew up in Benton, living his entire life on the same property. Stanhope's won awards with the vehicle, even including when it was a primer gray in 2020.

The car show usually brings thousands of people to the downtown streets, checking out the shiny engines and cars with their hoods open. There was at least one vintage VW bus and some rat rods. On Saturday, music played as the warm spring sun caused the car paint to glow. Some of the songs that played included "Back and Black" and "Radar Love."

Newton Area Chamber of Commerce Executive Director Pam Stevens was glad for the turnout "I know there were a lot of cars there," she said. Also happy with attendance was Mid Kansas Muscle Cars. "We thought the turnout was great with it being a holiday weekend," said Brian Robinson with Mid Kansas Muscle Cars. "We were able to extend the show to Eighth Street and another half block on Seventh to the west, which helped people spread out a little." They believe they had 325 cars, trucks and motorcycles there."
