- Update regarding Coles Pond dredging. The area is to be turned into a public park; we may need to do some clearing/cleanup in that area.

Julie talked about her background; she has volunteered in a number of environmental and conservation roles, is the current knowledge-keeper for the Mi'kmaq Confederacy, and has a lot of experience as a board member.
