FOREWORD

The Doctrine of Excuses and the Recovery of the Second Adam by Design

This document is related to the **By Design Bible Study** series and exists to draw directly from Scripture—*not to improve upon it, replace it, or compete with it*—but to assemble biblical truth **thematically**, so that God’s intended design for human life, obedience, and faith may be clearly seen, tested, and lived.

This volume, *Doctrine of Excuses is a Development of Action* that addresses a problem that is not merely theological, but **operational**: Why do so many believers sincerely confess faith in Christ, yet continue to live as though obedience is impossible, sin is inevitable, and transformation is theoretical rather than attainable.

The central problem of perpetual sinning has emerged as a Doctrine of Excuses that misleads the Church. The result of this examination unmasks the deception of this religiously based framework making clear an alternate argument that rejects **excuse-based theology**. **There has been a deception** that has developed over centuries—maybe unintentionally by those often called the fathers of the faith—that actually separates the believer’s life from the life Jesus who lived and made a way for a lost man to be redeemed unto God.

These doctrines of excuses as they are called herein do not always deny Scripture outright; instead it works deceptively as a reinterpretation of Jesus Christ in such a way that his victory becomes **non-transferable**, his obedience becomes **unrepeatable**, and his command to “*go and sin no more*” becomes inspirational rather than credible.

At the heart of this problem lies a single, decisive question:

Did Jesus overcome sin as God using divine advantage, or as a man? Did the Second Adam—live by faith in obedience and with complete dependence upon the Father separate from an embedded deity or nature of God and man or duality of nature fully God and fully man? Might there be a reason that the sovereign God and the council of the Godhead inclusive of the Son of God set aside the deity of the Spirit of Christ when the Word became flesh as declared by scripture? The answer scripture reports is that Jesus was born a man and his equality was to the first Adam and not to God. No earthly father, divine origin, sinless at creation. Obedience to the Father alone were the makings of Jesus submission to the Father. The temptation in the wilderness by Satan the tempter was legitimate where Jesus resisted temptation without sin. The sacrifice of Jesus Christ was also legitimate in that he became sin as the sin of the world was placed upon him. If Jesus was in any way divine in addition to his being made in the likeness of the flesh of man, then Satan could call foul as to why he could live sinless unto death if not a man alone. There would be no victory, and Satan would call out that there was a foul, a cheat. Satan would then be able to keep his fallen man as a slave to sin and death. Fortunately, Jesus was the second Adam and not divinity intertwined with flesh. If there was any equality that Jesus had it was with the first Adam that would lead to a validation of living by faith if Jesus lived sinless unto death.

This document argues from Scripture that **Jesus Christ came as man—made flesh—without a divine nature or self-advantage of divinity**. Jesus as the second Adam was equal to the first Adam’s state of beginnings. There was a holy Adamic starting point. The first Adam disobeyed by a surrendering of his will to Satan and

the second Adam obeyed by a surrendering of his will to the Father. Jesus only did what came from the Father. Jesus victory over sin and death was achieved **within the same volitional and faith-based domain into which believers are now invited to share in the fullness of God's redemptive plan. Salvation by faith was also a call to a life to walk in the Spirit to live a sinless life of perpetual obedience and victory until the end of this earthly journey and no longer obey the lust of the flesh. The result giving such divine attribute to Jesus has several problems. First, it would deny a transferable victory over sin and death as a God-man obedient to the Father.** This volume does not deny Christ's preexistence glory or deny his post resurrection exaltation and divinity. Rather, this study insists that **Jesus' became flesh and his earthly obedience was real, volitional that sought only obedience to the Father, sinless unto death, giving the sacrifice becoming sin at great cost, and the resultant victory over sin and death - precisely because Jesus lived as man. Not as a sinful man under the first Adam's fall and not under the law of sin and death but as the Second Adam, sinless obedience** trusting the Father, empowered by a faith that communed in obedience to the Father and believed the Word—*the very pattern given to those who believe that can live in obedience to the father and do his will by humble submission and faith in the God in the Gospel.*

For this reason, "*Doctrine of Excuses – Development of Action*" should be read alongside the accompanying **Operations Manual**, which addresses how the New-Man functions day-to-day: renewing the mind, walking by faith, discerning God's will progressively, and resisting sin righteously and no longer living by excuse unto sin, but by authority unto righteousness.

This is not a call to controversy of credulity. It is a call to **credibility**.

Development of Action Plan

This document entitled the “Doctrine of Excuses” provides insight into deeply entrenched religious dogma that has infiltrated the Christian religion for over 1600 years. Nor did anyone consider that Job, in the book of Job, was given a choice by God to decide mercy or judgement over his friends that had angered God. God did not like Job’s choices of friends as they did not speak the truth about God, but Job did. Job chooses to forgive their sins as stated Job showed his friends mercy.

The discussion that follows in this analysis was conducted with an interactive AI. The discussion led to an understanding that exposes the error that Christians adopt as core beliefs excuses for sin after believing and receiving salvation in Christ. I call those doctrines that give allowance for living sinfully the “Doctrines of Excuses.” There is a need to reshape anew a focused response that to bring every Christian back to being able to live sinlessly by faith. These doctrines are reviewed and expose the development of this errant framework of excuses when those doctrines embrace a return to the sin nature rather than faith in the victory over sin and death secured by the death and resurrection of Christ on the cross. His obedient and sinless choices along with the Scriptures reveal that a believer can choose to enjoy the “New-Man” by salvation rather than return to the mud-pile of sin.
