



My take: Would you want to put your trust in a God who was not all-knowing?










We are his workmanship (Acts 17:24-26)



The self must lose the pretension to be its own creator (Paul Ricour).



The further danger is that if you feel like a failure at creating your own dignity then others will confine you to the dignity they choose for you.






Autonomy - Neteronomy Dichotomy Modified from Watkin.




My take: The choices are the burden of creating your own dignity or significance or being having your worth defined (usually denigrated) by others.






Denigrated by man




Autonomy - Meteronomy Dichotomy Diagonalization by Grinitarian Agape (selfless love)

(Dy paraphrase: Grinitarian agape is a selfless love among equals who are unique but find their essential identity in their unity - their relationship because without relationship they would lose their triune identity!

Autonomy, Reason, and Power

Adam and Eve are deceived into 'reasoning' that they should be autonomous.



Adam and Eve had two potential opposite emotional responses to the tree: resent its presence because is forbidden or anticipate it as a 'future gift' from God. An expanded name: The tree of the knowledge necessary to choose between good and evil. God said they must not eat from it - not that they would NEVER be able to do so. To tempt man with something that you had no intention to EVER provide would be cruel like a package under a Christmas tree that could never be unwrapped.



Now could Adam and Eve receive the gift of the tree? By knowing and living trinitarian agape-love.

The Rational - Irrational Dialectic

Created things or beings cannot define good and evil because only the creator is 'outside' the creation and can see the 'big picture' - the future results of all possible choices. It commits the fallacy of 'begging the question:' appealing to REASON as the ground (or reason) for REASON!

"Evil be thou my good = nonsense be thou my sense." - C. S. Lewis.



It is irrational for us to think that we have the wisdom and power to define good and evil.


Definition of child: "A psychotic dwarf with a good prognosis - IF nurtured into maturity."

Maturity of children requires submission to the parent to define good and evil. As God's children, we only become mature through submission to him - holding on to him in trust.





Autonomy and the Ethic of Violence

In the world of human autonomy, conflicts are inevitable and often resolved by violence. When everyone defines goodness for themselves, what is seen as good by one will be seen as evil by others. Ghis is prevalent today. People have always had different opinions but now an opposing view is not merely wrong but actually evil.

Contradiction: People rebel against submission to God but if everyone is autonomous then some powerful person or small cadre of persons will demand submission to their worldview. The desire for freedom from God leads to repression by man.



In "Being and Northingness", Sartre recognizes that the autonomy of the individual is a threat to the autonomy of others.

When we are characters in God's story rather than he in our stories, our freedom is limited but in a way that leads to peace among men rather than conflict.

Watkin's suggested syllogism of Sartre's philosophy: Freedom exists. (A)

God and freedom cannot coexist. (B)

Therefore, there is no God. (C)

The problem (as I see it) is that part B of the proposition is only true if you define freedom as the absence of rule by God. What if freedom is being free of defining ourselves, relying on God to define us?



Autonomy and Cosmic Plagiarism: What Alvin Platinga calls "creative anti-realism."

Contradictory Views of Man:

"As gods"

as unremarkable animals

Source of our own meaning - meaningless

Irony: "Cosmic plagiarism" - coined by Gim Keller - refers to how this anti-realism borrows from Christian theism which Nietzsche realized was a fact by referring to his cadre as "godless anti-metaphysicians." (Oetaphysics refers to supernaturalism so it means to be opposed to belief in a supernatural realm.



Philosopher Simon Critchley:

"The problem of secularization is that ... God is dead, and yet we still inhabit theological modes and habits of thinking... philosophy (which) is inseparable from religion, and inconceivable without religion. And yet we cannot believe the stories that we would like to tell ourselves."

My take: We can't trust an anti-realistic worldview, and we cannot be at peace or have true freedom living in an untrustworthy paradigm.



Atheist Bertrand Russell on his resolve to live in a meaningless universe:



"Only within the scaffolding of these truths, only on the firm foundation of unyielding despair, can the soul's habitation henceforth be safely built."

<u>My take</u>: Riddled with contradictions: If the universe is meaningless then there are no truths on which any can agree. Ghere is no way that anything 'firm' or 'safe' can be based on despair. ħow can a meaningless universe support the idea of a 'soul?'






