




The few, the chosen, the Prophets!






Kings only have authority under God: even pagan Kings!






Challenge Question for Week 11:

The essential question: Where does truth come from?



From inside culture or from outside?

The War of Facts vs Truth




Everything we hear is an opinion, not a fact. Everything we see is a perspective, not the truth.



Some of the doors of our perception are closed - like GEHAZI who could not see the divine warriors protecting Elisha.




Prophets open the doorway to the infinite reality of God.

The Prophets did hold back the full truth, like the apostle Paul said in Acts 20:27: I did not shrink from telling you the whole counsel of God.




God intervenes in culture by speaking truth through his prophets.

Prophets remind the people of the covenant relationship with God that they freely accepted.

Samuel was the last "prophet-priest-king" until Jesus came. He had divine authority and secular institutional power. After him, these roles are separated because the people demanded a human king.

1 Samuel 8 is a pivotal chapter of warnings regarding human kings.

Watkin points out that if the Bible was written as "royal propaganda," it would not include 1 Samuel 8!




Welcome the loyal opposition.




Who most effectively speaks the truth to power today? Who supports the people's right to hear the truth?

Satire gets our attention: penetrating our hearts.




Jesters in Medieval courts could speak the truth and survive!

As covenant enforcers, the prophets have spiritual power.



They enforce with words, not bullets.



Prophets (like cops) remind the people that they consented to live under the law.





Politicians tell the people what they want to hear - the "noble lie" or "official lie."

Prophets tell the people what they need to hear - God's truth.





But if people don't believe in absolute truth, then they won't listen to truth as in the case of Pontius Pilate: Jesus says "I am the truth" and Pilate asks: "What is truth?" - then walks away.

Today, a person might respond: "Your

Today, a person might respond: "Your truth or my truth?"



Moses defines true prophets.


But a prophet who presumes to speak in my name anything I have not commanded, or a prophet who speaks in the name of other gods, is to be put to death."

You may say to yourselves, "How can we know when a message has not been spoken by the Lord?" If what a prophet proclaims in the name of the Lord does not take place or come true, that is a message the Lord has not spoken. That prophet has spoken presumptuously, so do not be alarmed.



But are there "true" prophesies that don't come to pass?

There are instances where God uses a prophet to warn people. If they heed the warning, then the prophesied judgment may be removed or delayed. Example: Jonah and Nineveh.





Are prophesies fulfilled only once?

Walken proposes a "triad" of fulfillments of some prophesies:

First - historical fulfillment.

Second - fulfillment in the 1st coming of Jesus.

Third - fulfillment in the 2nd coming of Jesus.



Example: DAVIDIC DYNASTY.

First - historical fulfillments from Solomon to the last pre-exilic king.

Second - fulfillment in the 1st coming of Jesus as "Son of David" - as spiritual king.

Third - fulfillment in the 2nd coming of Jesus as eternal king.



Biblical Prophets come from inside the group they criticize as in the case of Isaiah confessing that he was from a people of unclean lips. Modern prophets see themselves as outside the group they criticize: Greta Thunberg, Climate Activist.

Biblical Prophets come from within culture but their message is from beyond culture promoting conformity with TRUTH.

Modern secular prophets come from within culture but their message is from themselves promoting conformity with their feelings - their perceived "facts."

Feelings are real but they are not REALITY!



Key Questions about what we see and hear:

First: Is it a "fact" affected by human perspective or an absolute truth spoken by God?.

Second: Is it consistent with scripture? (Bereans: Acts 17:11) Is it consistent with God's attributes and his covenant? Third: Is it something that I am applying only to others, not to myself?




Challenge Question for Week 12:
