FAITHFULLY YOURS

We hold our breath and we wait for Easter to dawn with its light, its hope, and its promise of new life, everlasting life. As we wait, we join Jesus for His Last Supper with His disciples. We kneel with Him in the garden as He prays to God in anguish, shedding tears of blood. We hear Peter's words denying He even knows Jesus, wondering and worrying that we might have said the same.

We journey with Him to Calvary, carrying our own crosses, our own burdens, our own sins, our own sorrows. And then at the foot of the cross we hear His last words, and weep with the other women who are there, with His mother Mary. And then we walk to the garden tomb where He was buried, trembling with sadness and fear for what might await us.

The trend of the data for the virus seems to be improving so that hopefully soon we will be meeting in person with appropriate precautions and beginning our new church year for boards and committees. In anticipation of this, the Deacons are asking for members who are not already on a board or are leaving another board to seriously consider joining the Deacons Board for 2021-2023.

According to the church's By-Laws, Deacons have several main responsibilities. The first is working with the pastors to minister to the spiritual needs of this church and community. They assist in the preparation and administration of ordinances, in caring for the poor, the sick, the sorrowing, and the stranger, as well as cultivating and nurturing prospective members. They also make the necessary preparations for communion services. There are a few other small responsibilities that they have as situations arise regarding membership and pulpit supply. In addition they are also responsible for several projects that have been established over the years, such as the Christmas Families project through the Children's Bureau of LA, the Christmas in July project, the Angel Fund, organizing the Laity Sunday service, hosting an all church picnic on Rally Day, and assisting with Holy Week services.

In the past, the Board consisted of 12 members that serve a two year term with the option of serving one more term. Currently there only eight active Deacons, and two of those have completed their two terms plus stayed on the board an extra year because of the pandemic. A minimum of two new people will need to be added in order to fulfill the responsibilities that need to be completed.

Being a part of the Deacons is interesting and very rewarding. Working together we become bonded in our service to God, our members, pastors, and community at large. There is a helpful manual that outlines the responsibilities and projects of the Deacons. A MISSION MOMENT: A letter from UrbanHarvestor & StoneSoupProjectLA

Happy Spring to our friends at Congregational Church of the Chimes!

Here's hoping you all are staying safe and healthy through these challenging times. It is with delight that I am sharing my *mission moment* with you for April '21.

Early in 2020, Urban Harvester launched "The Chill Project" to help non-profits gain extra freezer space for food donations. Our plan began with the purchase of a small freezer to expand capacity in order to distribute frozen meals, like quarts of soup and chili. We successfully placed our first freezer at the start of the pandemic with The Senior Center of Pasadena, whose clientele includes homeless and senior adults from surrounding areas. The Chill Project facilitated dozens of precooked soups and stews for their clients to enjoy at home. Soon after,we began connecting ready to share meals and produce to many non-profits such as Hope of the Valley, Mend and the Hollywood Food Coalition.

One of our partners is locally-based Chef Richard Weinroth: You may remember Richard for his inspiring western-themed meal that he created for the CotC annual dance and fundraiser. I was proud to be his sous Chef and many friends came forward to assist us that day as well. Richard recently launched a new project called *The Stone Soup Project LA*. For those who love a hearty soup or stew, Richard cooks them fresh in a professional kitchen and hand delivers to your door throughout Los Angeles. Customers purchase freshly frozen quarts of soup for their home, and many happy customers end up freezing his products for future use. *The Stone Soup Project* donates additional quarts to non-profit organizations, and Urban Harvester sponsored enough for Richard to cook 50 quarts of soup to assist Church of the Chimes' community service efforts. If you'd like to join in supporting this project with us, we invite you to check out his tasty soup and enjoy!

Looking forward to seeing everyone again in the near future, and hope you and your communities stay safe and well!










COTC: A diverse, and loving Christian community accepting of all.
